

## B I R D C A L E N D A R

As in March the weather in April continued unusually mild until the 24<sup>th</sup> day, when a strong wind set in from the north, and unlike previous storms of the year it held steadily from this point for three successive days. This brought freezing temperatures with considerable destruction to the early blossoming fruits - cherries, plums and peaches - in the central districts of Ohio. Though the temperature dropped to 31° on the Heights, the fruit, thanks to our proximity to the Lake, and to cloudy skies, escaped with but little injury.

In spite of the early high temperatures prevailing, the apple-buds were later checked so that the trees on the Heights came into full flower at the usual time, - May 10-14, and with few exceptions the migratory birds have held to their usual schedules. Possibly 3 inches of rain fell from May 1 - 20 (1.8 inches from May 1 - 12), but up to the present the season has been favorable to bird-life.
