'The time of singing birds has come', when thousands of Regular Migrants from the south are reaching us in their homing flights, many to remain in Cleveland, but far more to pass to their breeding grounds in the north.

Students and all others who are interested in Birds are invited to contribute to this record, and the names of all Migrants from the south, as well as of all Winter Residents or Visitors, seen or heard since December 1, 1918, will be welcomed. Birds in the field are identified by their size, form, color-marks, call-notes, song, flight and general habits. Reports should include the Name, Date, Place and the approximate Number of Individuals seen at a given time.

Reports may be given or sent to Instructors at the Biological Laboratory, or to Students in Biology 10.

Assistance in identifying birds and suggestions for studying them will be given gladly at all times to any who are interested in ornithology.

Bulletins will be issued on approximately March 15, April 15, and May 15.
