At this season birds can be identified usually by their size, form, coloring, call notes and general habits. Reports should include the Name, Date, Place of Observation, and the Approximate number of individuals seen, accuracy being the great desideratum. Aid in determining the names of unidentified species will be given gladly. Reports may be made to Miss Hart, and to other members of the course in Bird-Study, Biology 10 , of Adelbert College and the College for Women, or to the undersigned at the Biological Laboratory.
