
Since the last issue of the <u>Calendar</u>, the following former "reporters" for the Calendar have joined the armed forces of our country:

#### Precipitation Records

For the sake of completing the precipitation record for one of the wettest years in recent history here, we include the chart at the right. Note: Each spoke of the wheel from center to circumference stands for 3 inches of water. The dotted line shows normal precipitation, the solid line, the actual record for 1942. Excess precipitation since January 1 is 5.23 inches of water (to Nov. 30).
