FIVE SPECIES OF WINTERING HUMMINGBIRDS FOUND IN TENNESSEE IN WINTER 1997-1998

The winter of 1997-98 was a remarkable one for both the number and the diversity of the hummingbirds which were recorded across the state. No fewer than nine individuals of five different species were banded this past winter in Tennessee by Bob and Martha Sargent of Trussville, Alabama. The nine individuals consisted of one Calliope Hummingbird (*Stellula calliope*), one Black-chinned Hummingbird (*Archilochus alexandri*), two Ruby-throated Hummingbirds (*Archilochus colubris*), one Allen's Hummingbird (*Selasphorous sasin*), and four Rufous Hummingbirds (*S. rufus*). The Sargents received reports of at least six other late fall or winter hummingbirds, most likely of genus Selasphorous, which they were not able to band. Of the species which had previously been recorded in Tennessee, only Anna's Hummingbird (*Calypte anna*) was not observed last winter. Below is a summary of the dates, locations, and other pertinent information about each bird.

Calliope Hummingbird. This hatching-year female, a first Tennessee record, was the star of the winter hummer spectacle for most area birders. Ed and Evelyn Wright first observed the bird at their east Nashville feeder on 2 November, but its identity was not confirmed until it was banded on 2 December. "Katie" delighted the Wrights and hundreds of visitors until her departure on 1 April 1998. This record has since been accepted by the Tennessee Bird Records Committee (TBRC) and added to the Official List of Tennessee Birds. On 1 January, participants in the Hickory-Priest Christmas Bird Count recorded this bird. Based on the information provided on the compilation form, compiler Chris Sloan believes that this is the first Calliope Hummingbird ever recorded on a North American Christmas Bird Count.

Black-chinned Hummingbird. This hatching-year female, a second Tennessee record, would likely have stolen the show were it not for the presence of the Calliope Hummingbird. First recorded on 7 December, it was banded and its identity confirmed on 14 December at the home of Mrs. Pat Fraley in Franklin. Interestingly, Fraley first observed the bird feeding on insects in her yard. She promptly put her hummingbird feeders back out, and the bird soon became a regular visitor. On 20 December 1997, this bird was recorded during the Nashville Christmas Bird

Count. This record has since been accepted by the TBRC. Tennessee's first Blackchinned Hummingbird was observed at a feeder in east Chattanooga from 7 December to 24 February.

Allen's Hummingbird. This hatching-year male was present at the feeder of Bennette Rowan in Johnson City, Tenn. from 17 November until 16 December. The Sargents banded this individual on 3 December. The TBRC has verified this record, and it constitutes the third documented Allen's Hummingbird in Tennessee. Both previous records are from east Tennessee, one from Soddy Daisy and one from Knoxville. Two other Allen's Hummingbirds were banded last season just outside the Tennessee lines, including one in Ringgold, Georgia, and one in Bristol, Virginia.

Ruby-throated Hummingbird. Prior to last winter, only two Ruby-throated Hummingbirds had ever been banded in winter in Tennessee. Thus, in Bob Sargent's opinion, banding two Ruby-throats in Tennessee this past winter was a tremendous treat. One was a hatching-year female banded 2 December in Nashville at the home of Bill and Dot Midgett, and the other was a hatching-year male banded in January in Santa Fe. Based on the deep, extensive bill striations and nestling behavior exhibited by the bird in the hand, the Sargents believe that the Nashville bird probably hatched in late September or October.

Rufous Hummingbird. Of the six species of hummingbirds which have been recorded in Tennessee, Rufous Hummingbird is the species most frequently encountered. This winter was no exception, with the Sargents capturing four birds of this species in Tennessee. On 14 December, hatching-year males were banded in Franklin at the home of Frank and Delores Gensci and in Lebanon at the home of Gwen Davis. On 16 January, an adult female was banded in La Follette at the home of Susan Kitts. Also on January 16 the Sargents recaptured an adult female which they had originally banded the previous winter at the same location in Townsend.

Each winter, birders and banders all across the eastern U.S. are learning about the surprisingly diverse array of hummingbirds which occasionally visit our feeders in winter. As recently as 1990, the Official List of Tennessee Birds contained only two species of hummingbirds (Robinson, 1990). As more people leave feeders up throughout the winter and lines of communication continue to develop, we will continue to learn and be amazed by these colorful and hardy visitors!

RECENT NEST RECORDS OF THE BLACK-THROATED GREEN WARBLER IN TENNESSEE

During 1994 and 1995, I observed five nests of the Black-throated Green Warbler (Dendroica virens) in Tennessee. Although this species is widespread and fairly common to common in the Blue Ridge, Cumberland Plateau, and Cumberland Mountains (Nicholson 1997), I found only three previous Tennessee nest records during extensive searches of the literature, egg collections, and Cornell Laboratory of Ornithology Nest Record Cards. All of these previous records were observations of nests under construction. Therefore, I feel publication of details of my recent observations is warranted.

Nest 1, found by Scott Pearson and me on 29 April 1994, was located on the Tennessee-North Carolina border about 200 m west of Indian Gap, Great Smoky Mountains National Park, at an elevation of 1670 m. The female warbler was building the nest about 8 m up in a yellow birch (*Betula alleghaniensis*). The nest was located on a 5 cm diameter horizontal branch where it forked into three other horizontal branches. The exterior of the nest was constructed of bits of birch bark and plant down, bound with spider webs. We observed the female shaping the nest cup by crouching in the nest and molding it with her body.

Nest 2 was located along old State Highway 63 near Cove Creek about 5 km northwest of Caryville, Campbell County, at an elevation of 344 m. It was straddled on a fork of an upward sloping branch of a boxelder (*Acer negundo*), about 5.5 m above the ground. The nest tree was adjacent to the road and the nest was visible from the road. When I first discovered the nest on 13 May 1995, the female was incubating four eggs. On 17 May, she was still incubating four eggs. On 18 and 21 May, she was again on the nest; I did not check the nest contents on either of these days. On 24 May, the nest contained four young about five days old; and on 30 May the nest was empty and intact. During my inspections of the nest on 13 and 17 May, the female sat very closely and did not flush from the nest until my hand was less than 30 cm from the nest.

Nest 3 was located in Frozen Head State Natural Area, Morgan County, about 1 km northwest of Frozen Head fire tower at an elevation of about 825 m. It was about 10 m high in a 15 m tall basswood (*Tilia heterophylla*) on a slightly upsloping limb at its junction with two almost vertical branches. The nest was near the middle of the tree canopy and about 2 m from the trunk tree and 1.2 m from the end of the limb. When found on 19 June 1995, the nest contained at least three large nestlings, close to fledging, being fed by the male and female adult warblers.

Nests 4 and 5 were located a few hundred m apart on the north slope of Young Mountain in southwest Scott County, at an elevation of about 700 m. I found both of them on 8 June 1995. Nest 4 was 6.4 m above ground on a horizontal branch of a 15 cm diameter black birch (*Betula lenta*). The nest was about 2 m from the main

trunk of the tree and no other branches or leaves shielded it from the sides or below. Although I was unable to determine its contents, I observed an agitated female in the nest tree.

Nest 5 was 9.4 m above ground in a 20 cm diameter sugar maple (*Acer saccharum*). It was built against the main trunk of the tree at the base of a limb. The nest contained a large Brown-headed Cowbird (*Molothrus ater*) nestling. During about 15 minutes of observation, I watched the female adult warbler feed the cowbird nestling 4 times. No other nestlings were visible.

EVIDENCE OF VIRGINIA RAIL NESTING IN WEST TENNESSEE

On 11 May 1998, while mowing a 12-acre pasture which borders a six-acre pond near Williston, Tennessee in Fayette County, I flushed a bird which I did not immediately recognize but instantly labeled as an unusual bird for this place. The bird came up out of the grass from so close to the tractor that it was in the tractor's shadow. It flew away from me, keeping just above the level of the grass and landed in the wet area close to the pond. What I noticed immediately was a long, down-curved bill and legs that hung down almost vertically on a bird about the size of a meadowlark, with almost no tail. The bird flew fairly awkwardly, never more than about six inches above the top of the grass, and disappeared from sight the instant it landed. Because the tractor was running, I don't know whether or not it called.

I stopped the tractor and walked back down towards the pond. As I approached the area from which the first bird had flushed, a second bird hopped out of the long grass; it remained and started to move across the mowed area, heading for the tree-line at the edge of the field. This juvenile bird was almost solid dull black on top, with some gray wash around the eyes in the form of a developing cheek mark and lighter gray feathering on the underside of its body. The area below the very short tail appeared almost a dirty light gray. It would let me approach to within about 18 inches, then it would hop ahead of me in a low, short flight of 2-3 feet. Upon landing, it spoke in a clear double-click, each time repeated twice. When I would approach again, it would gape at me and call the double-click before moving off ahead. I drove the bird ahead of me in this fashion until it reached the protection of the tall grass at the edge of the field. Then I left the field and stayed out of it until dusk of the following evening, because I wanted to give any rails a chance to find cover.

Although I listened every evening, it was five days before I heard a rail call. The call came from below the pond, where there are areas that are not mowed until later in the summer, and thus provide much better cover than the relatively open expanse of the horse pasture. The call clearly had the "speed-up," double-click pattern of a Virginia Rail. I later heard it three times from the same area and once from across the road, at the edge of a neighboring pond. If the bird had been calling earlier this spring, before I sighted it, I wasn't listening closely enough to distinguish the call from that of the frogs around the pond. A horse pasture would not ordinarily be typical habitat for a Virginia Rail (Rallus limicola), but this spring was exceptionally rainy - so wet that I hadn't been able to mow until almost a month later than usual. The mixed grasses in the pasture were 18-30 inches high. The area from which the birds flushed was at the high end of that range, and about 12 feet from the pond. With the amount of rain we had had, that area, although not actually a marsh, had certainly been wet much of the previous month. That end of the pond is very shallow; I can wade in it to 200 feet out and still be only up to my waist, so it would not be impossible to imagine the area as rail habitat. The pond is frequented year-round by Green-backed Herons (Butorides virescens), Great Blue Herons (Ardea herodias), Belted Kingfishers (Ceryle alcyon), Red-winged Blackbirds (Agelaius phoeniceus), grebes in the winter and geese in the spring. Killdeer (Charadrius vociferus), Eastern Meadowlarks (Sturnella magna), and Northern Bobwhite (Colinus virginianus) are known to nest in the pasture routinely.

Breeding activity in Virginia Rails in Tennessee begins in March and egg-laying begins as early as late March (Nicholson, 1997). Although there are no nesting reports for the Virginia Rail in West Tennessee, there are sufficient occasional sightings between early March and mid-May that the bird is considered unusual but not entirely unlikely (Robinson, 1990; Waldron, 1998). In Arkansas, the bird is known to spend time in "wet open fields and other unexpected places" (James and Neal, 1986). In Kentucky, the Virginia Rail has been recorded as "also occurring in weedy or grassy fields with dense cover." A number of nest records exist for East Tennessee, and nesting has been reported in Maury County in central Tennessee, as far south and west as Louisiana, as well as in northern Alabama (Nicholson, 1997). Absence of previous nest records for West Tennessee probably reflects the absence of interested observers in Tennessee's more rural counties, rather than an absence of habitat.

TERRITORIAL WINTER WRENS IN THE CUMBERLAND MOUNTAINS OF TENNESSEE

During the summers of 1994 and 1995, I observed one and three Winter Wrens (*Troglodytes troglodytes*), respectively, at Frozen Head State Natural Area, Morgan County, Tennessee. These are the first breeding season records of this species from the Cumberland Mountains of Tennessee. The normal breeding range of the Winter Wren in Tennessee is restricted to the Blue Ridge Mountains, where it usually occurs above 900 m elevation (Robinson 1991, Nicholson 1997). Although two August records exist from the Cumberland Mountains of Kentucky, the species is not known to occur there during its breeding season (Monroe et al. 1988, Palmer-Ball 1996).

On 16 June 1994, I observed a singing Winter Wren at about 850 m elevation along the North Mac Trail on Old Mac Mountain. I first heard the wren singing at 0715 about 900 m NNW of Frozen Head Fire Tower. During the next 35 minutes, the wren continued to sing the long, complex songs typical of its species as it moved about 400 m towards the west and slightly downslope, parallel to the trail. I then left the area and did not observe the wren when I hiked back through the area about three hours later.

My next observation was on 20 May 1995, at about 880 m elevation, 700 m southwest of the Frozen Head fire tower. This singing bird was near the edge of a bird census plot, and I observed it on five of eight later visits. My last observation of this bird was on 24 June. All of these observations were within an area of about 250 m diameter, and the wren appeared to be territorial.

On 19 June 1995, I observed two additional singing Winter Wrens along the North Mac Trail. The first of these birds was near where the wren was first observed in June 1994. The second bird was about 900 m down the trail from the first bird, at about 790 m elevation. I again observed a wren singing at the location of the first bird on 24 June. I did not revisit the site of the second wren on North Mac Trail.

All of these observations of Winter Wrens were on north-northwest to north-northeast slopes in mature mixed mesophytic forest between 790 and 880 m elevation. Tulip-poplar (*Liriodendron tulipifera*) was among the most common tree at each site. Other overstory trees present included sugar maple (*Acer saccharum*), buckeye (*Aesculus spp.*), cumbertree (*Magnolia acuminata*), northern red oak (*Quercus rubra*), and black cherry (*Prunus serotina*). Hydrangea (*Hydrangea arborescens*) was common in the understory at each site, and the lowermost site on North Mac Trail had dense tangles of Dutchman's breeches (*Aristolochia durior*). The herbaceous layer at each site was dense, and common herbs included goatsbeard (*Aruncus cioicus*), Solomon's seal (*Polygonatum biflorum*), black cohosh (*Cimicifuga racemosa*), bellwort (*Uvularia spp.*), and stinging nettle (*Urtica dioica*). The bird first observed on 20 May 1995, was often near a rock bluff about 7 m tall. The two locations along North Mac Trail were near ravines containing scattered boulders.

THE OFFICIAL LIST OF TENNESSEE BIRDS 1998 UPDATE

The Tennessee Ornithological Society's Certification Committee, now the Tennessee Bird Records Committee, was formed in 1982 to assemble the official list of Tennessee birds (Nicholson 1983). Subsequently, the committee has provided four addenda to the list (Nicholson and Stedman 1988; Knight 1993, 1996; Greene 1997). However, a complete list of the state's birds has not been published since 1983. The following list contains all species accepted by the committee through 1997.

Acceptance criteria have remained the same throughout this period. A species is placed on the confirmed list based upon either 1) extant verified specimen, photograph or sound recording, or 2) satisfactory written details of three independant sight records. Lacking these levels of documentation, a species is placed on the provisional list based upon one or two sight records with satisfactory written details. Acceptance to either list requires an unanimous decision by the committee.

The current list consists of 370 confirmed species and 20 provisional species for a total of 390 species accepted in Tennessee. Taxonomy follows the A.O.U. (1998). The list is divided by families.

THE 1997 CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT

Reports were received from 25 counts conducted in Tennessee for the 1997-1998 Christmas Bird Count season. Over 750,000 individual birds representing 158 species were counted (Table 1). This was 15 more species than reported in the 1996 Christmas Count. A relatively mild winter probably accounted for the presence of a number of species not normally found in Tennessee this late in the year. Eighteen species were represented by only one individual; 31 species were reported from only a single count. Species of note included Red-throated Loon, Red-necked Grebe, Eared Grebe, Great Egret, Mute Swan, Brant, Black Scoter, Oldsquaw, Broad-winged and Swainson's Hawk, Prairie Falcon, Virginia Rail, Spotted Sandpiper, Dunlin, Lesser Yellowlegs, Forster's Tern, Eurasian Collared Dove, four hummingbirds (Ruby-throated, Black-chinned, Calliope, and Allen's), an Empidonax and a Great Crested Flycatcher, swallows, Fish Crow, two vireos (White-eyed and Blue-headed), five warblers (including Orange-crowned, Black-and-white, and Palm), Whitewinged and Red Crossbills, Lapland Longspur, and Snow Bunting. Red-breasted Nuthatches, Purple Finches, and Pine Siskins were well represented across the state, and crossbills and Evening Grosbeaks were recorded in several counts.

The highest species totals were observed on the Reelfoot and Chattanooga counts, with 112 species recorded on count day (Table 1). Seven additional species were found within the Reelfoot circle during count week. The Savannah, Hiwassee, and Nickajack Lake counts also cracked the 100 species threshold for count day. Counts in east Tennessee generally reported lower numbers than those in west Tennessee, with Roan Mountain and Shady Valley reporting the lowest numbers. Nineteen of the 21 counts with results for both 1996 and 1997 reported more species in 1997, and five of these exceeded their 1996 total by 10 or more species.

Two hundred ninety-eight people participated in this year's counts. The Chattanooga count had the greatest number of participants (34), followed closely by Nashville, Knoxville, Hiwassee, and Memphis (Table 2). Chattanooga and Memphis also tallied the most party hours. Three counts included birding by boat as part of their effort. Twenty of the 25 counts spent at least some time owling. A new count was started in Fayette County.

INFORMATION ON THE COUNTS

BRISTOL: 28 Dec.; 0530-1730. Weather: cloudy; wind NW 0-5 mph; temp. 25-38°F; 1-2" of snow on ground; open water. Fourteen observers in 6 parties put in 53 party hours and covered 388 party miles. In addition, 5 hours and 35 miles effort went into owling. 81 species; 9,341 individuals. Participants: Rob Biller, Janet Brown, Jennifer and Emily Burkey, Ron Carrico, Wallace Coffey, Sarah Garrett, Ken Hale, Rick Knight, Tom Laughlin, Phillip Lewis, Richard Lewis (compiler: 407 V.I. Ranch Road, Bristol, TN 37620), Amanda Martin, and Van Remsen. The Allen's Hummingbird was the first record of this species for the state of Virginia pending acceptance by the Virginia records committee (the Bristol count includes parts of both Tennessee and Virginia). Blue-headed Vireo was a first record for the Bristol count. Other highlights include Eared Grebe, Double-crested Cormorant, Oldsquaw, Common Goldeneye, Bald Eagle, Fox Sparrow, Swamp Sparrow, and Brewer's Blackbird.

BUFFALO RIVER (35° 18'N, 87° 28'W): 26 Dec.; 0630-1700. Weather: cloudy with light rain/snow in afternoon; wind NW 0-10 mph; temp. 36-43°F; open water. Thirteen observers in 5 parties put in 48 party hours and covered 258 party miles. In addition, 1.5 hours and 3.5 miles effort went into owling. 77 species; 6,948 individuals. Participants: Michael Beuerlein, Connie Holman, Chester and Dorothy McConnell, Royce Neidert, Donette Sellers, Matthew Sides, Don Simbeck (compiler: 424 Riddle Lane, Loretto, TN 38469), Levi Townsend; Alex, Becky, Morris, and Rita Williams.

CHATTANOOGA (35° 06'N, 85° 14'W): 20 Dec.; 0730-1730. Weather: wind N 0-10 mph; temp. 36-63°F; open water; no snow. Thirty-four observers in 14 parties put in 116 party hours by foot, car, and boat and covered 544.5 party miles. In addition 10.5 hours and 70.6 miles effort went into owling and 2 hours into feeder watching, 112 species; 66,636 individuals, Participants: Chappell and Ralph Brown, Mary Lynn Buttram, Kevin Calhoon, Janice Chadwell, David Chaffin, Carla Christensen, Sally Clark, Jack Colcolough, Tom Crittenden, William Haley, John Henderson (compiler: 7323 Fairington Circle, Hixson, TN 37343), Dan Jacobson, Al Jenkins, Bonnie and Dawn Johnson, Jonnie Sue Lyons, Barbara and Mike McMahan, Tom Patton, Don Ritzhaupt, Peter Robinson, Tommie Rogers, Rebecca Rudd, Debbie and Roi Shannon, David Vogt; Blake, Cynthia, and Jimmy Wilkerson; Dan Williams, Hayden Wilson, and Libby Wolfe. Noteworthy species included 1 Snow Goose, 4 Black Scoters, 1 Broad-winged Hawk, 2 Forster's Terns, 3 Eurasian Collared Doves, 1 Great Crested Flycatcher, 2 Sedge Wrens, 1 Marsh Wren, 1 White-eyed Vireo, 1 Blue-headed Vireo, and 1 Orange-crowned Warbler. Notable by numbers were 34 Common Loons and 35 Pine Siskins.

CLARKSVILLE (36° 30'N, 87° 23'W): No report.

COLUMBIA (35° 36'N, 87° 10'W): 20 Dec.; 0500-1630. Weather: wind S 0-5 mph; temp. 38-58°F; open water; no snow; cloudy. Nine observers in 5 parties in the field plus two at feeders. Party hours in the field totaled 43.5 and covered 373 miles. Participants also logged 9 hours at feeders and covered 18 miles in 6.5 hours of owling. 92 species; 6,700 individuals. Participants: Bob and Janet Brown, Tom Edwards, William Fuqua, William Jernigan, Allyn Lay, Anne and Bedford Lochridge, and George (compiler: 999 Sunnyside Dr., Columbia, TN 38401) and Cleo Mayfield. Notable species on this years count included 2 Snow Geese (1 blue form), a Redhead, a Virginia Rail, and a Vesper Sparrow.

COOKEVILLE (36° 09'N, 85° 28'W): 20 Dec.; 0145-1645. Weather: wind SW 0-5 mph; temp. 42-60°F; sky partly cloudy in the morning followed by a clear afternoon. Sixteen observers in 6 parties put in 52.5 hours and 430 party miles. The count also included 6 hours and 71 miles owling. 73 species plus 7 count week; 8107 individuals. Participants: Heather Bolte, Ginger Ensor, Graham and Holly Kash, Amy Mercer, Lynda Perry, Thomas Roberts, Joanne Schaefer, Jeanne Schmitzer, Richard Simmers, Barbara and Stephen Stedman (compiler: 2675 Lakeland Dr., Cookeville, TN 38506), David Sugeno, Kim Tarter, Catherine and Winston Walden. Notes: This marked the 35th annual Cookeville count. An Orange-crowned Warbler during the count and Common Loons during count week were new species, not found on any of the previous 34 counts. Other notable species included 2 Northern Pintail, 7 American Coots, and a Palm Warbler. Both warblers represent first Putnam

Co. winter records. A Bald Eagle observed during count week was only the 6th record for Putnam County and only the 2nd record for the Christmas count. Eight species (Common Loon, Canada Goose, Carolina Chickadee, White-breasted Nuthatch, Golden-crowned Kinglet, and Orange-crowned, Yellow-rumped, and Palm Warblers) were observed in record numbers on this count. Notable for low numbers included Loggerhead Shrike (missed on count day for first time in over 10 years), Northern Mockingbird (lowest number in over 10 years), and Eastern Meadowlark.

CROSS CREEKS N.W.R. (36° 28'N, 87° 45'W): 3 Jan.; 0700-1630. Weather: wind SW 10-15 mph; temp. 55-60°F; sky partly cloudy in the morning and afternoon. Fourteen observers in 6 parties put in 55.5 hours and 351 party miles. 69 species + 1 CW; 10,854 individuals. Participants: Margarette Blanton, Joe Casey, Lorine Dodd, Susan Eberly, Jack Foddrill, Debbie and Steve Hamilton, Blake Hunt, Abigail Kimmel, Madge Lawrence, Joyce North, Sarah Welker (compiler: 643 Wildlife Rd, Dover TN 37058), and Christine and Clarence Wilson. Notable species include Brant, Redhead, 3 Bald Eagles + 2 more CW, Lincoln's Sparrow, and, by its absence, Loggerhead Shrike.

DRESDEN (36° 17'N, 88° 42'W): No report.

ELIZABETHTON (36° 20'N, 82° 08'W): 20 Dec.; 0615-1715. Weather: wind W 0-5 mph, gusty at high elevations; temp. 24-57°F; sky partly cloudy. Sixteen observers in 5 parties put in 43 party hours and 258 party miles plus 2 hours and 6 miles of owling. 70 species; 4052 individuals. Participants: Fred Alsop, Ed Burke, Wallace Coffey, Gilbert Derouen, David Fenner, Reece Jamerson, Brian Jones, Rick Knight (compiler: 804 N. Hills Dr., Johnson City 37604), Charles Moore, Kevin Pierce, Michelle Price, Bryan Stevens, Glenn Swofford, Allan Trently, Gary Wallace, and Frank Ward. Red-throated Loon was observed for only the 2nd time on this count. White-eyed Vireo was observed for the first time on count day; previously this species had been recorded during a count week. The House Wren was only the 9th occurrence for this count.

FAYETTE COUNTY: 3 Jan. Weather: temp. 51-68°F; wind S 10 mph; sky partly cloudy. Eleven observers in 5 parties were in the field for 39 party hours and 255 party miles plus 1 hour and 1 mile owling. 74 species; 8860 individuals. Participants: not provided. Compiler: Richard Whittington, 338 Williamsburg Lane Memphis, TN 38117. Interesting birds included 4 Pine Warblers and a Lincoln's Sparrow. Not found were Gray Catbird, Lapland Longspur, Barn Owl, and Eastern Screech Owl. This was the first year for the Fayette County count which includes the historic Ames Plantation and the Beasley tract along the Wolf River.

GREENEVILLE: 3 Jan.; 0530-1830. Weather: wind calm; temp. 23-60°F; sky clear to mostly clear. Water partially frozen. Fifteen observers in 9 parties covered 207.2 party miles in 37 party hours by car, on foot, and by boat. Time was also spent owling (0.75 hrs) and at feeders (25.5 hrs, 4 additional observers). 76 species; 5622 individuals. Participants: Ben, Mark, and Phine Britton; King and Margaret Gaut, Bruce Grimes; B.D, Barbara, Carrie, and Henrietta Holt; Jim Holt (compiler: 311 Colonial Circle, Greeneville, TN 37745), Rick Knight, Alice Loftin, Don Miller, Velda Ruth Moore, Richard and Willie Ruth Nevius, Helen Reed, and Virginia Williams. The 76 species recorded this year tied the high for the past decade in this count.

Good birds included Ruddy Duck (2), Rough-legged Hawk (1), Merlin (1), Wild Turkey (15), a "woodpecker grand slam," Horned Lark (2), Red-breasted Nuthatch (8), House Wren (1), Brown Thrasher (2), and Purple Finch (10). The 118 Eastern Bluebirds was a new high number. Disappointing misses included Evening Grosbeak, Pine Siskin, and Brown Creeper.

GREAT SMOKY MOUNTAINS N.P. (35° 43'N, 83° 29'W): 28 Dec.; 0630-1500. Weather: temp. 25-40°F; wind calm; sky clear. Seventeen birders in 8 parties covered 143.3 party miles in 42.5 party hours and put in 0.5 hours and 3 miles owling. 57 species; 1575 individuals. Participants: Marcia Davis, Linda and Samuel Fowler, Maurice Grigsby, Jerry Hadder, Angela Harding, Paul Hartigan, Tony Headrick, Susan Hoyle, Kristine Johnson, Joel Keebler, Nathan Klaus, Barbara Mandrus, Martha Rudolph, Susan Schott, Boyd Sharp, and David Trently (compiler: 1029 Morrow Dr., Knoxville, TN, 37923-1725). Highlights of the count included a Blackcrowned Night-heron, a Blue-headed Vireo, and 151 Evening Grosbeaks. Road conditions prevented birding at high elevations, so species such as Black-capped Chickadee were missed.

HICKORY-PRIEST (36° 12'N, 86° 40'W): 1 Jan.; 0530-1730. Weather: temp. from 30s to 50s°F; partly cloudy skies, no rain or snow. Eleven observers in 5 parties logged 43 party hours and 344.75 party miles. Observers also covered 17 miles in 3.5 hours of owling. 88 species plus 1 count week; 78,092 individuals. Participants: Ed Byrne, Paul Cambre, Hazel Cassel, Phillip Casteel, Beth Creighton, Jerry Drewry, Joe Francis, Polly Rooker, Chris Sloan (compiler: 1410 25th Ave S., Apt. #610, Nashville, TN 37212), Joe Stone, and Sabin Thompson. Noteworthy sightings included 15 Greater Scaup, 1 Peregrine Falcon, 4 Red-breasted Nuthatches, 1 Orange-crowned Warbler, 7 Chipping Sparrows, 202 Rusty Blackbirds, 3 Pine Siskins, and 1 Calliope Hummingbird. The Calliope Hummingbird may be a North American Christmas Bird Count first!

HIGHLAND RIM: 1800 26 Dec-1800 27 Dec. Weather: temp. 32-40°F; sky cloudy with a.m. snow flurries; open water. Sixteen observers in 9 parties birded over 31 party hours and covered over 56.6 party miles. 65 species; 7,702 individuals. Participants: John Bruner, Tom Burleson Jr. and Sr., David Burleson; Van Lisa, and Carole Colebank; Glen Estep, Mark Kelly, John Lamb, Ruth Luckado, Phil and Nicky Medley, Erma Rogers (compiler: 161 Roscoe Lynn Rd., Hillsboro, TN 37342), Quincy Styke, and Stewart White. Species found included Ruddy Duck, Loggerhead Shrike, Pine Warbler, and White-crowned Sparrow.

HIWASSEE (35° 22'N, 84° 54'W): 1 Jan.; 0600-1800. Weather: temp. 18-46°F; sky clear, wind calm. Twenty-six observers in 9 parties combined for 76 party hours (plus 3.5 owling) and 297 party miles (plus 51 owling) by foot, car, and boat. 102 species; 19,873 individuals. Participants: Nelson Bennett, Clyde Blum, Mary Lynn Buttram, Kevin Calhoon (compiler: 1185 Mountain Creek Rd., Apt. 715, Chattanooga, TN 37405), Janice Chadwell, Carla Christenson, Tom Chittenden, Jenni Frakenberg, Danny Gaddy, Bill Haley, John Henderson, Bonnie Johnson, Laura Mitchell, Johnny Parks, Tommie Rogers, Rebecca and Robin Rudd, Debbie and Roi Shannon, Boyd Sharp, David Trently, John Upchurch, Chris Welsh, Caleb Wiese, and Hayden Wilson. The species count of 102 was the highest in many years, perhaps partly due to the high number of observers. Presence of irruptive species such

as Pine Siskins increased the species number. Blue-headed Vireo and Marsh Wren were good finds, and the dark-phase Swainson's Hawk sighting has been submitted to the Tennessee Bird Records Committee. The number of Sandhill Cranes observed has continued to increase, and "puddle duck" numbers were also up. Missed but probably present was American Woodcock.

JACKSON (35° 37'N, 88° 49'W): 27 Dec.; 0600-1730. Weather: wind SW 5-10 mph; temp. 25-45°F. Five observers took the field in 3 parties putting in 31 party hours and covering 257.8 party miles. Observers also spent 0.5 hours and 2 miles owling. 84 species (plus 2 count week); 70,035 individuals. Participants: Bob Ford, Mark Greene (compiler: 81 Trenton Hwy, Humboldt, TN 38343), Rick Light, and Bill and Joyce Reinke. Common Merganser and Bufflehead were new species for the count. Fish Crows have become regular in winter at a large crow roost in Jackson. The Jackson count was the only Tennessee count reporting Fish Crows on count day (Reelfoot reported them during count week).

KINGSPORT: 31 Dec.; 0645-1715. Weather: wind W-NW 5-15 mph; temp. 23-29°F; sky mostly cloudy with intermittent snow flurries; 2-4" of snow. Eight observers in 3 parties put in 23 party hours plus 0.5 hours owling. 67 species plus 6 CW; 4129 individuals. Participants: Janet Brown, Greg Church, Teresa Hutson-Feliu, Rick Knight (compiler: 804 N. Hills Dr., Johnson City 37604), Greg McConnell, Emily Sikora, Arthur Smith, and Howard Young. Notable species included Common Loon, count week Double-crested Cormorant, Greater Scaup, Common Goldeneye, Redheaded Woodpecker, and Loggerhead Shrike.

KNOXVILLE (35° 55'N, 84° 05'W): 4 Jan. Weather: light variable wind; temp. 35-61°F; sky mostly sunny. 84 species; 12,421 individuals. Twenty-seven observers in 12 parties birded 65.7 hours and covered 351 miles. They also spent 2 hours at feeders and 0.5 hours and 0.2 miles owling. Participants: Jane Beintema, Frank Bills, Betty Reid Campbell, Jim Campbell, Marcia Davis, Dean Edwards, Paul Hartigan, Tony Headrick, Ron Hoff, Susan Hoyle, Kris Johnson, Dev Joslin, Joel Keebler, DollyAnn Myers, Chuck Nicholson, Holly Overton, Karen Petrie, Martha Rudolph, Mike Ryon, Beth Schilling, Susan Schott, Boyd Sharp, Christine and Roger Tankersley, Allan and David Trently, and Melinda Winters. Compiler: Audrey R. Hoff, 4523 McCloud Rd., Knoxville, TN 37938. The Knoxville count was the only count to report Great Egret and Black-and-white Warbler. Also of note was a single Gray Catbird, one of only 3 reported across the state.

LEBANON: No report.

MEMPHIS (35° 09'N, 89° 56'W): 21 Dec.; 0600-1730. Weather: temp. 43-54°F; wind east up to 46 mph; sky cloudy with heavy rain; no snow, open water. Twenty-six observers took to the field in 10 parties covering 221 miles in 116.5 party hours. 92 species; 67, 434 individuals. Participants: Carolyn Bullock, Fred Carney, Lula Coffey, Theresa Cross, Jim and Sue Ferguson, Bob Ford, Harry Gayden, Van Harris, Martha Heinemann, Bob Ilardi, Margaret Jefferson, Keith Kunkel, Selma Lewis, Knox Martin, Sarah McBryde, George Payne, Rob Peeples, Gaynell Perry, Dick Preston, Ernie Restivo, Virginia Reynolds, Martha Waldron (compiler: 1626 Yorkshire Dr., Memphis, TN 38119), Barbara Wilson, and John and Linda Zempel. This was the 70th continuous count conducted by members of the Memphis Chapter of the Tennessee Ornithological Society. Notable species included the only Mute Swans

(4) reported, a Spotted Sandpiper, and Lincoln's Sparrow (2).

MURFREESBORO: 3 Jan. Weather: windy, sunny, and warm with temp. 50-60°F. Seven observers in 4 parties were in the field 23.75 party hours and covered 197 party miles. Seven feeder watchers in 4 parties observed for an additional 17 hours. 64 species; 9074 individuals. Participants: Bertha Christzberg, Richard Hunter, Wilma Hunter (compiler: 3659 Wilson Overall Rd, Murfreesboro, TN 37127-7598), Dan and Mary Ann Jackson, David McCarroll, Matt and Jane Newberg, Pat and Robert Sanders, Ferrell Wilson, and Terry Witt. Species of note: Snow Goose (2), Redhead (6), and Rusty Blackbird (20).

NASHVILLE (36° 03'N, 86° 56'W): 20 Dec.; 0530-1700. Weather: temp. 44-63°F; wind north 0-9 mph; sky clear to partly cloudy. Thirty-three observers in 9 parties spent 68.25 party hours in the field, covering 304.5 party miles. In addition 2.5 hours and 10.5 miles were expended owling, and 9 feeders were watched. 88 species plus one count week and one unidentified flycatcher; 22,169 individuals. Participants: Sandy Bivens, Jean Buchanan, Ed Byrne, Drake Caldwell, Phillip Casteel, Ralph Cazort, Richard Connors, Beth Creighton, Debbie Dreves, Frank Fekel, Ed Gleaves, Boyd Goss, Barbara Harris, Bob Hatcher, Susan Hollyday, Barry Jernigan, Linda Kelly, Sue Marden, Gail Miller, Daniel Moss, Elizabeth OConnor, Bob Parrish, Kim Phillips, Polly Rooker, Jan Shaw (compiler: 5019 Timberhill Dr., Nashville, TN 37211-4333), Chris Sloan, Bob Van Kirk, Rita Venable, Cless Vinson, Shannon Walters, John Walton, Melinda Welton, and Mary Zimmerman. The Nashville hummers got a lot of press this winter and were cooperative enough to appear on count day. A Black-chinned Hummingbird and a Ruby-throated Hummingbird were observed. Both had been banded by Bob and Martha Sargent prior to count day. Other birds of note include an unidentified Empidonax flycatcher, a Gray Catbird, and a count week White-winged Crossbill. The species total was the highest since the count circle was formed in 1966.

NICKAJACK (35° 04'N, 85° 31'W); 3 Jan. Weather: temp. 27-65°F; wind variable 0-5 mph; mostly sunny. Twenty observers in 8 parties spent 79.75 party hours traversing 399.5 party miles. In addition 5.75 hours and 78.5 miles were spent owling. 100 species plus swallow spp. plus one count week; 30,918 individuals. Participants: Koyle Blevins, David Chaffin, Jerry Drewry, Danny Gaddy, Bill Haley, John Henderson, Dan and Kathy Jacobson, Bonnie Johnson, Starr Klein, Laura Mitchell, Johnny Parks (compiler: 164 McDonald Dr., Ringgold, GA 30736-7213), George Parsley, Tommie Rogers, Rebecca and Robin Rudd, Joe Stone, Sabin Thompson, David Vogt, and Hayden Wilson. This was the 13th annual count for Nickajack Lake. The Mourning Dove count was a record low while record high counts were reported for American Crow, American Pipit, and Brown-headed Cowbird. Northern Harrier was missed for only the second time in 13 years; Wild Turkey and Whiteeyed Vireo were observed for only the first and second time, respectively. Also a first record were the swallow spp. reported, the only swallows reported during the count period across the whole state. Although most likely these were Tree Swallows, the observers were unable to make a positive identification. A Peregrine Falcon was also noteworthy. Counting the swallows, the tally of 101 species ties for the second most ever with the record at 102 species.

NORRIS (36° 13'N, 84° 05'W); 20 Dec.; 0600-1700. Weather; temp. 31-55°F; wind NW 0-5 mph; sky clear. Thirteen observers in 7 parties birded 54.5 party hours

covering 324 party miles plus 2.5 hours and 5 miles of owling. 70 species plus one count week; 5601 individuals. Participants: Dean Edwards, David Hankins, Tony Headrick, Audrey Hoff, Susan Hoyle, Dev Joslin, Joel Keebler, Nathan Klaus, Charles Nicholson (compiler: Box 402, Norris, TN 37828), Martha Rudolph, Boyd Sharp, David Trently, and Chris Welsh. Good numbers of Red-breasted Nuthatches (34) and Purple Finch (25) were observed. Other sightings included Bald Eagle (4), Red-headed Woodpecker, and Palm Warbler (2).

REELFOOT LAKE (36° 25'N, 89° 23'W): 20 Dec.; 0500-1800. Weather: temp. 35-45°F; wind N 5-20 mph. Thirteen observers took the field by foot, boat, and car in 4 parties, covering 258 party miles in 41 party hours. One hour and 5 miles were spent owling. 111 species plus 7 count week and an unidentified night-heron; 93,982 individuals. Participants: Jerry Drewry, Bob Foehring, Mark Greene (compiler: 81 Trenton Hwy, Humboldt, TN 38343), Joe Guinn, Paul Hertzel, Rebecca Irwin, Nancy Moore, David Nailling, Joe Stone, Sabin Thompson, Jeff Wilson, and John and Linda Zempel. Pine Warbler and Snow Bunting were new species for the Reelfoot count. Red-necked Grebe was recorded for only the second time. Several species once considered rare on the Reelfoot count have become regular when sufficient effort is spent looking for them: Greater Scaup, Short-eared Owl, House Wren, Marsh Wren, LeConte's Sparrow, and Lapland Longspur. Count week Prairie Falcon and Orange-crowned Warbler were also good sightings.

ROAN MOUNTAIN (36° 06'N, 82° 07'W): 21 Dec.; 0630-1715. Weather: wind E 0-10 mph, but 15-20 mph above 5500'; temp. 27-46°F; sky cloudy with fog above 5500'; patches of snow above 5000'. Eleven observers in 3 parties covered 140 party miles in 25 party hours and put in 1 hour and 1 mile owling. 48 species; 802 individuals. Participants: Fred Alsop, David Fenner, Jacki Hinshaw, Lisa Jones, Rick Knight (804 N. Hills Dr., Johnson City 37604), Jennifer and Tom Laughlin, Larry McDaniel, Bryan Stevens, Allen Trently, and Gary Wallace.

SAVANNAH (35° 08'N, 88° 09'W): 2 Jan.; 0400-1730. Weather: temp. 39-59°F; wind S 5-25 mph; sky partly cloudy. Ten observers in 6 parties put in 60.5 party hours and 464.8 party miles plus 3.5 hours and 35.3 miles owling. 102 species; 201,207 individuals. Participants: Michael Beuerlein, Jeff Garner, Mark Greene, Francis and Gary Markine, Sean and Steve McConnell, Elizabeth and Floyd Sherrod, and Damien Simbeck (compiler: 4905 County Rd. 33, Killen, AL 35645). Highlights included Merlin, Sedge Wren, Marsh Wren, Gray Catbird, Palm Warbler, and Lincoln's Sparrow.

SHADY VALLEY: 27 Dec.; 0720-1700. Weather: temp. low to mid-30s, overcast with light snow all day, 1-4 inch accumulation. Thirteen observers in 5 parties birded 38.5 party hours covering 224.2 party miles. 53 species; 4245 individuals. Participants: Rob Biller, Janet Brown, Ron Carrico, Wallace Coffey, Glenn Eller, Rick Knight, Tom (compiler: 124 Sugar Hollow Ridge Rd., Roan Mountain, TN, 37614) and Jennifer Laughlin, Richard Lewis, Dennis Testerman, David and Ben Walters, and Paul Wharton. Notable were 25 Red Crossbills.

ANN T. TARBELL (1916-1998)

MARY ZIMMERMAN 1618 Lillian Street Nashville, TN 37206-2038

The Tennessee Ornithological Society mourns the death of Ann Tarbell, who died at her home on 6 August 1998. A long-time TOS member, she held numerous offices including Chapter Secretary, State Director, TOS Vice-President and NTOS Vice-President for Programs. Though she had been battling cancer for almost a year, she was still able to hike on the TOS summer birding trip in the Great Smoky Mountains in June. Ann was 82 years old.

Originally from Concord, Massachusetts, Ann graduated from Radcliffe College, summa cum laude, in 1937, and received a Ph.D. in Chemistry from Columbia University in 1942. During World War II, she worked on the Manhattan Project analyzing samples from Oak Ridge. She co-authored two books on the history of Chemistry with her husband, Dr. Stanley Tarbell, of Vanderbilt University.

An avid birder, Ann began collecting tower kills with Katherine Goodpasture shortly after moving to Nashville from Rochester, New York, in 1967, and continuing through the spring migration this year. She was continually and faithfully involved in numerous statewide and local avian programs, including breeding surveys and the MAPS program. A long-time bander, she banded at the former NTOS property, "Two Jays"; Katherine Goodpasture's property at Basin Spring; and in her own yard in Forest Hills. In addition, Ann was actively involved in the breeding atlas project, surveying several blocks, including the Radnor block. Of Ann's many contributions to the birding community, what stand out most are her diligent efforts in the campaign to save Radnor Lake from commercial development. She maintained her strong interest in Radnor by continuing to work tirelessly toward the purchase of additional lands surrounding the lake, including the Hall Tract. She was also an active member of the Friends of Radnor Lake, one of whose recent accomplishments was the closing of Otter Creek Road to vehicles. The Radnor Lake State Natural Area is honoring her efforts by dedicating a new library to Ann's memory. The library is in the new Jeffries Environmental Education Building, which is located on the Hall Tract, just south of the lake.

Ann also worked tirelessly for the Nashville Chapter, producing the newsletter and the members' yearbook, and serving as the chapter Compiler for the Audubon Christmas Count, as well as the TOS spring and fall counts. For many years she spearheaded the myriad details involved in the successful hosting of the spring State Meeting when it was held in Nashville. In addition, she wrote numerous articles for *The Migrant* and delivered several papers at state meetings. In recognition of her many contributions to TOS and bird studies, Ann was awarded The Distinguished Service Award by TOS at the Spring State Meeting in 1997. She will be greatly missed.

DR. JOSEPH C. HOWELL (1913-1998)

Dr. Joe Howell, long-time member of the Knoxville Chapter of the Tennessee Ornithological Society, died from the effects of Alzheimer's disease on 10 June 1998. He is survived by his wife, and two daughters and two stepsons from previous marriages. Joseph Corwin Howell was born on 3 March 1913 in Orlando, Florida, where he lived until 1935, the year he completed a B.A. degree at Rollins College. Dr. Howell had an early interest in birds, as evidenced by his becoming a member of the American Ornithologists' Union at age 15 in 1928. In his youth he became an avid egg collector, a hobby that was enhanced by his athletic ability and his tall, wiry build. Dr. Howell donated his egg collection, consisting of 3690 eggs (1095 sets of eggs) of 134 species of birds, 107 from Florida, to the American Museum of Natural History in 1940. He completed a Ph.D. degree at Cornell University in 1940. Dr. Arthur A. Allen supervised Dr. Howell's research on the American Robin. A condensed version of his dissertation was published in a paper entitled, "Notes on the nesting habits of the American Robin (Turdus migratorius L.)" (1942. American Midland Naturalist 28: 529-603). In the six decades since its publication, this monumental paper has been studied and cited by virtually every researcher who has studied American Robins.

Dr. Howell began his professional career in 1940 at Oklahoma A & M College (now Oklahoma State University), but his teaching career was interrupted by World War II. During 1943-1945 he served as a lieutenant in the U.S. Navy. While far from land in the Gulf of Mexico, he watched small, migrating birds land on his ship. His observations helped answer the then hotly debated question about whether or not small birds were capable of trans-Gulf migrations. On 1 September 1946, Dr. Howell became an Instructor in the Zoology and Entomology Department at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. He remained there until his retirement, with the rank of professor, on 1 September 1978.

During Dr. Howell's UT years, he taught courses in Animal Behavior, Comparative Anatomy, Mammalogy, and Ornithology. He directed the graduate programs of numerous M.S. and Ph.D. students. Some of these research projects involved studies of animal behavior and ecology, both of mammals and birds, while other projects dealt with population changes. Dr. Howell realized the value of documenting both the occurrence and size of populations.

He was especially interested in fluctuations in the size of bird and mammal populations, and developed methods to measure bird populations. In 1951 he published an article entitled, "The roadside census as a method of measuring bird populations" (Auk 68: 334-357), which helped establish the idea that bird populations could be reliably and effectively described with roadside counts.

Not surprisingly, Dr. Howell participated in, and was a major contributor to the

establishment and implementation of, the Breeding Bird Surveys from their beginning in 1966. Today we recognize the Breeding Bird Survey data as one of the most valuable sources of information about bird populations in North America.

In 1957 Dr. Howell and a former student, Muriel B. Monroe, published, "The birds of Knox County, Tennessee" (Journal of the Tennessee Academy of Science 32: 247-322). This article described the status of every species known to have occurred in Knox Co. in recent times. The article has frequently been updated, but it still serves as a valuable source of information about the occurrence and population sizes of the birds in Knox Co. In a similar endeavor, Dr. Howell and James M. Campbell studied the birds of Campbell Co., Tennessee, for many years. They published "Observations of Campbell County birds" in 1972 (Migrant 43: 1-4). Dr. Howell long had an interest in the Bald Eagles nesting in central Florida, and documented the decline in this population in a 1965 paper (co-authored by G.M. Heinzmann), "Comparison of nesting sites of Bald Eagles in central Florida from 1930 to 1965" (Auk 84: 602-603).

His many students, professional acquaintances, fellow members of the TOS, and other friends will remember Dr. Howell as a quiet, conservative gentleman who thought carefully before he spoke. At meetings of the Knoxville TOS Chapter (which he supported for nearly 50 years), his polite inquiries to the reporter of some rare bird ("Are you sure? Did you see the wing bars?") frequently culminated in a comment that left no doubt that Dr. Howell was not convinced. Knowing that Dr. Howell was going to question unusual reports made the members better observers and raised the credibility of the records.

Dr. Howell was a positive influence on many students, both undergraduate and graduate. His interests in animal behavior, mammals, and birds have benefited not only students, but the citizens of Tennessee and the U.S. as well. His support of the TOS, especially the Knoxville Chapter, was important in maintaining the vitality that is needed for an organization of this type to be effective. As one of his last graduate students, I especially benefited from Dr. Howell's advice and example. I treasure my association with him.

MINUTES OF THE 1998 SPRING MEETING TENNESSEE ORNITHOLOGICAL SOCIETY DIRECTORS

The Spring meeting of the Tennessee Ornithological Society (TOS) was held on 1-3 May 1998 in Nashville. The meeting was hosted by the Nashville Chapter. Several field trips were taken to local points of interest, and a banquet was held on Saturday night for those members attending the meeting. The meeting was called to order by TOS President Susan McWhirter. Secretary Knox Martin reported a quorum present. Copies of the minutes of the Fall meeting were made available to those present for review. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Van Harris with a second by Harriette Spiegel. The motion was approved by a unanimous vote of those present.

REPORTS OF OFFICERS. West Tennessee Vice President Bob Ford reported that The Mississippi Museum of Natural Science is moving along with the project of putting all of TOS member Ben B. Coffey's birding records on computer; at least \$3,000 is still needed to complete this project. There was no report from Middle Tennessee. East Tennessee Vice President Ron Hoff reported that osprey nesting platforms are still being erected, with at least four new ones in 1998; some of the platforms put up in the past are currently being used by osprey.

DIRECTORS AT LARGE. No reports.

SECRETARY'S REPORT. Knox Martin requested that all chapter officers supply him with names and addresses of all chapter officers well before the state meetings. This is especially true if there have been changes in officers since the last state meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT. Treasurer David Trently presented the following report: Total income from all areas was \$32, 658.55. Total expenses were \$12,880.82. Total operating assets, including savings, checking, stamps, and the Dean Witter Trust Liquid Asset Fund was \$49,080.14. Anticipated liabilities were \$53,100. The Endowment Fund contained 8896.724 shares @ \$19.55 for a total of \$173,930.95, making the total assets (Operating Assets plus Endowment Fund) \$223,011.09.

CURATOR'S REPORT. No report.

MIGRANT EDITOR Dev Joslin reported that the June 1997 issue had been mailed. The September 1997 issue is about to go to press and should be out by late June. The final issue should be out soon after that. More articles are needed for future issues, so send them to Dev. It is about time to issue a new membership directory. This is usually done every three years, but it has been almost 10 years since the last directory was published in 1989. The next directory should also include E-Mail addresses. All information should be turned in to local chapter treasurers. The 1994-1996 issues of The Migrant are at the printers. The 1994 annual issue has been printed. It is hoped that all issues will be mailed by the Fall meeting. Special thanks go to Martha Waldron, Carolyn Bullock, Richard Lewis, Bob Ford, and Rick Knight for all their work.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE. Chuck Nicholson introduced Chris Sloan, the President-elect for next year who will be officially nominated at the banquet. If anyone would like to volunteer to be an officer, see either Chuck or one of the other members of the committee, Carolyn Bullock or Mary Zimmerman.

FINANCE COMMITTEE. George Payne reported that everything was in order with the TOS finances. Due to the amount of money in the Endowment Fund, it might be wise in the future to diversify.

PROJECT FUNDING & CONSERVATION COMMITTEE. Bob Hatcher had some new proposals for the Katherine Goodpasture Memorial Grant. There were seven applicants for grants in 1997, but so far in 1998 there have been none. As a result, the following recommendations were made. The deadline for applications will be extended until 18 May. Awards will be increased from the current \$250 to \$300, and all information concerning the grant will be posted on the TOS website. Since the funding for the grant comes from donations made to the Nashville TOS Chapter in memory of chapter member Katherine Goodpasture, it is probably best to save it for now with the Nashville Chapter. In the future, it might be possible to combine the fund with the Project Funding & Conservation Committee and make a statewide award or some other conservation award. Project Funding & Conservation Committee members could meet with the members of the Katherine Goodpasture Grant Committee and try to iron out some guidelines for future committee funding. TOS President Susan McWhirter nominated Gaynell Perry of Memphis, Melinda Welton of Nashville, and Frank Bills of Knoxville as new members of the Project Funding & Conservation Committee. A motion was made from the floor by Ron Hoff and seconded by Betty Reed Campbell to approve the nominations. The vote was unanimous. Melinda Welton reported on the meeting of the Conservation Committee. The committee recommended that the TOS become a charter member of the Gulf Coast Bird Observatory, a group of states that help monitor bird migrations around the Gulf of Mexico. Tennessee would become the first member-state not bordered on the Gulf. There is a one-time fee of \$150 to join. A motion was made by Melinda Welton and seconded by Dev Joslin for the TOS to join. The vote was unanimous. George Mayfield reported on the current status of the Endangered Species Act. It is currently up for renewal and there are several bills currently under review. Two are the Kemp-Thorne Bill #1180 (Negative), and the Miller Bill HR2351 (Positive). Write your representatives and senators about your opinions of these bills. There is also a problem concerning the number of towers being put up around the state. Studies need to be started that will look at the problems of bird collisions with these towers. The FCC also needs an Environmental Impact Statement. A motion was made by Virginia Reynolds and seconded by Chuck Nicholson that called for each chapter to adopt a tower and monitor it for bird kills. Melinda was asked to draw up guidelines for the collection of data from the various collectors at each tower. The vote was unanimous.

TENNESSEE BREEDING BIRD ATLAS. Chuck Nicholson reported that the Atlas was done and that he was resigning as chairman of the committee. He suggested that the TOS begin looking into the possibility of doing another Atlas in a few years, possibly in a combined effort with neighboring states.

TENNESSEE BIRD RECORDS COMMITTEE. Chairman Chris Sloan, speaking for committee members Paul Hertzel, Dick Preston, Kevin Calhoun, and Linda Northrop, pointed out that it was their opinion that the BRC was not up to par with

similar committees around the country. It was necessary to expand its responsibilities from the current voting on first, second and third state sightings of birds to a more important function of monitoring bird population trends in the state. Seasonal status reports of unusual bird species will now be looked at more carefully. ALL records will now be looked at, no matter how common the bird (cardinal in your yard, for example). The committee will be expanded from the current five members to six, two from each grand division of the state. Votes on a specific record will now be five out of six instead of the previous unanimous vote. Due to the increased responsibilities of the committee, members will be allowed to serve two consecutive terms instead of the current one term on the committee, followed by one term off the committee. This is important due to the fact that the increased responsibilities of the committee require more knowledgeable members who will need the option of longer terms of membership. A motion was made by Chris Sloan and seconded by Harriette Spiegel to accept the above changes to the BRC. The floor was then opened up for discussion. The motion was to accept the proposed changes "as is." The vote was by a show of hands of directors. The vote was 11 in favor of the motion and five (5) opposed. After more discussion, a motion was made by Virginia Reynolds and seconded by Dev Joslin to print all of the proposed changes in the Warbler. The vote from the floor was unanimous in favor.

CONSTITUTION & BYLAWS COMMITTEE. Virginia Reynolds introduced several proposals for changes and/or amendments to the TOS Constitution. They were: 1. Article V, Section 5: "The TBRC shall be a standing committee. Members shall be appointed by the President. Procedures of this committee shall be approved by the Board of Directors." Virginia Reynolds made a motion to adopt these changes. The motion was seconded by Chris Sloan. The vote was unanimous to adopt the changes. 2. Article X of the Bylaws. Changes to the Bylaws would be the same as changes to the Constitution. Virginia Reynolds made a motion to adopt the changes. The motion was seconded by Forrest Priddy. The vote was unanimous to adopt the changes. Virginia Reynolds then made a motion to print the above changes in *The Migrant*. The motion was seconded by Jim Campbell and passed by unanimous vote.

COLLATERAL COMMITTEE. No word from Bill Bridgeforth on decals. Patches are available for \$2.50 each. TOS Directories are available at \$3.50 each.

PARTNERS IN FLIGHT. Bob Ford reported that, thanks to Dolly Ann Myers and Ron Hoff, a slide projector has been donated to send to the Annabelle Dod Bird Club in the Dominican Republic. Dev Joslin reported on a possible field trip by TOS to the Dominican Republic in February 1999. See Bob Ford or Dev Joslin for details. Janet Troop of TWRA is working on a worldwide program concerning "Important Bird Areas." If you have a favorite spot in Tennessee to submit for consideration, see Janet for an application. Bob Ford reported that Tennessee Congressman Tanner submitted to the USF & WS a \$2 million rider for Partners in Flight. A letter of thanks from TOS will be sent to the congressman.

TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE. No report.

TENNESSEE WARBLER. More articles are needed, especially from the various chapters. The next deadline is 30 June 1998. Ron Hoff volunteered to put the Warbler on e-mail. Check with Theresa Graham if you are interested.

OLD BUSINESS

Ron Hoff reported on the upcoming International Migratory Bird Day on 9 May. Be sure to keep track of hours spent on foot and hours in the car, mileage on foot and mileage in the car, etc. Be sure to turn in cards.

The Fall meeting was to be hosted by the Lebanon Chapter. However, they have reported that, due to several factors, they will be unable to host the meeting. Susan McWhirter has made arrangements to have the Fall meeting at Paris Landing State Park in Paris, Tennessee, on 31 October and 1 November 1998. If any other chapter would like to host this meeting, please see Susan. David Pitts has agreed to chair the paper sessions. Fall meetings are usually pretty simple affairs, so a smaller chapter should be able to host one. Also, most meeting expenses are paid for by the state TOS if registration fees do not cover all the costs. See David Pitts if you have ideas for a paper presentation.

The Spring 1999 meeting will be held at Reelfoot Lake State Park with headquarters at Air Park. The dates are 30 April and 1-2 May. More details are available from Dick Preston.

Eighteen (18) counties participating was a high for this count, compared with 13 in 1997. Weather throughout most of the state was overcast, with a few areas of sunshine and some light winds. 

THE SEASON



Fall: 1 August-30 November 1997

For much of the state, this was a mild, wet autumn period. Near normal to slightly above normal temperatures prevailed through October, while November was cooler than normal. Above average rainfall soaked most areas except the northeastern corner. Based on the number and variety of reports, this seemed to be a good migration season. Two species were found for the first time in Tennessee — a Reddish Egret and a Calliope Hummingbird. Several other rarities, combined with the passage of the expected migrants, kept interest levels high. Three banding stations in the mountain region banded a cumulative total of 2000+ birds. Red-necked and Eared Grebes made early appearances in two regions apiece. White Ibises were found in all but the mountain region. Shorebirds staged an excellent showing. Four species of western hummingbirds were documented; most individuals were banded by Bob and Martha Sargent. Eurasian Collared Doves persisted in Chattanooga and two others were seen in West Tennessee as this species continues its spread in North America; observers should be alert for more to show up.

Among passerines, Olive-sided Flycatchers were reported from all four regions, while a Great Crested Flycatcher lingered remarkably late in East Tennessee. A modest incursion of boreal species began with the widespread arrival of Redbreasted Nuthatches in early September. Pine Siskins occurred widely, although somewhat sporadically, in November. American Tree Sparrows made early appearances in two regions.

WESTERN COASTAL PLAIN REGION: Above average rainfall and below normal temperatures did not keep 36 observers from spending 135 days in the field. The early Eared Grebe and Dark-eyed Junco set new West Tennessee arrival records, while the high numbers of Killdeer and Pectoral Sandpipers set new state records. The Eurasian Collared Dove was the second for West Tennessee. The Marbled Godwit, Red-necked Phalarope, Vermilion Flycatcher, Western Kingbird, Brewster's Warbler and Black-headed Grosbeak provided "fall color" in the area.

HIGHLAND RIM AND BASIN REGION: The four-month fall season produced a variety of weather. In Nashville, the total rainfall for the period was 18.5 inches compared to a normal of 13.8 inches. While August and October had normal amounts, both September and November were two inches above normal. The mean average temperature for August through October was normal, while November was again a clear abberation being 5 degrees cooler than normal.

During this period two birds new to Tennessee were seen in the Nashville area. An immature Reddish Egret was identified and photographed on an NTOS field trip to Gallatin Steam Plant. It remained for about a week enabling many birders to see it. Another first, a Calliope Hummingbird, was initially seen coming to an east Nashville yard on 2 November, although its true identity remained a mystery until Bob and Martha Sargent banded it on 3 December. In November a third state record Black-chinned Hummingbird was first seen in a backyard near Franklin. More on these and other hummingbirds in the greater Nashville area will be mentioned in the next report. Other unusual sightings included White-tailed Kite, Prairie Falcon and Yellow Rail.

Additionally, it appears that a whole host of northern invaders plan to spend the winter in the deep south this year. Red-breasted Nuthatches, Pine Siskins and Evening Grosbeaks had already arrived in middle Tennessee by the end of November.

CUMBERLAND PLATEAU/RIDGE AND VALLEY REGION: Autumn weather varied only slightly from average. August through October experienced near normal temperatures, while November was a bit cooler than average. Rainfall was unevenly distributed, with a near normal seasonal total at Chattanooga, but only two-thirds of the expected amount in the northeastern part of the region.

The general concensus was that this had been a good migratory season. Most regular species were reported in near average numbers. Diversity was good, including several unusual species. Rankin Bottoms, on upper Douglas Lake, hosted 18 species of shorebirds plus other waterbirds. A good variety of wetland birds were also found at Brainerd Levee in Chattanooga. The lone regional hawkwatch at Soddy Mountain reported 13 species of diurnal raptors, including a Northern Goshawk. The warbler flight was regarded as pretty good. A modest boreal influx was noted, with widespread Red-breasted Nuthatches and some scattered siskins and grosbeaks. Two western hummingbirds were found, with one lingering around a feeder for several days.

EASTERN MOUNTAIN REGION: Eared Grebes showed up very early on South Holston Lake this autumn, their fourth consecutive year present. A raft of coots on the same lake in mid-November was so dense and long (300 m) that they were impossible to count; they were estimated at between 3000 and 4000. Black-bellied Plover, American Golden-Plover, and Ruddy Turnstone were good shorebird records for South Holston Lake.

A strong cold front on 21 September produced a heavy fallout of migrating warblers. This was especially notable at Carver's Gap on Roan Mountain where Rick Knight's banding operation yielded nets full of birds. This banding station handled 727 birds of 45 species for the season. A banding station at Big Bald Mountain operated by the Mayfields captured 1102 birds of 42 species. Both stations are located on the Tennessee-North Carolina border. A low elevation banding station operated at Holston Valley in Sullivan County by Richard Lewis produced 202 birds of 40 species for the period.

INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

The Migrant records observations and studies of birds in Tennessee and adjacent areas. Most articles are written by members of the Tennessee Ornithological Society.

SUBMISSIONS: The original and, if feasible, two copies of the manuscript should be sent to the Editor: J.D. Joslin, 112 Newcrest Lane, Oak Ridge, TN 37830. Manuscripts that have been published in other journals should not be submitted. Electronic copies, on disk or sent by e-mail, are greatly appreciated.

MATERIAL: The subject matter should relate to some phase of Tennessee ornithology. It should be original, factual, concise, and scientifically accurate.

STYLE: Both articles and short notes are solicited; recent issues of *The Migrant* should be used as a guide in the preparation of manuscripts. Where more detail is needed, reference should be made to the *CBE Style Manual*; this book is available at many public libraries and from the Council of Biology Editors, Inc., 111 East Wacker Drive, Suite 3200, Chicago, IL 60601-4298.

COPY: Manuscripts should be typed *double-spaced* on 8.5×11 " paper with adequate margins for editorial notations. Tables should be prepared on separate sheets with appropriate title and column headings. Photographs intended for reproduction should be sharp with good contrast on glossy white paper; black-and-white photographs will usually reproduce better than color photographs. Weights, measurements, and distances should be in metric units. Dates should be in "continental" form (e.g., 16 March 1997). Use the 24-hour clock (e.g., 0500 or 1900).

NOMENCLATURE: The scientific name of a species should be given after the first use of the full common name in the text. The scientific name should be underlined and in parentheses. Names should follow the A.O.U. Check-list of North American Birds (sixth edition, 1983, or supplements).

TITLE: The title should be concise, specific, and descriptive.

ABSTRACT: Manuscripts of five or more typed pages should include an abstract. The abstract should be less than 5% of the length of the manuscript. It should include a brief explanation of why the research was done, the major results, and why the results are important.

LITERATURE CITED: List all literature citations in a "Literature Cited" section at the end of the text. Text citations should include the author and year.

IDENTIFICATION: Manuscripts including reports of rare or unusual species or of species at atypical times should include: date and time, light and weather conditions, exact location, habitat, optical equipment, distance, behavior of bird, comparison with other similar species, characteristic markings, experience of observer, other observers verifying the identification, and reference works consulted.

REPRINTS: Reprints are available to authors on request. Billing to authors will be through the TOS Treasurer.

SEASON REPORTS: Observations that are to be considered for publication in "The Season" section should be mailed to the appropriate Regional Compiler. Consult a recent issue of *The Migrant* for the name and address of the compilers.
