PROPOSAL TO AMEND BY-LAWS

IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE XIII, SECTION 1, ALL MEMBERS OF THE EASTERN BIRD BANDING ASSOCIATION ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED OF A PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE II OF SAID BY-LAWS. THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO BE DESIGNATED SECTION 4, READS: "TO ENCOURAGE ITS MEMBERS TO BAND ONLY THOSE SPECIES OF BIRDS WHICH ARE PERTINENT TO THEIR SELECTED STUDY PROJECT, THEREBY CAUSING MINIMAL DISRUPTION OF THE ENVIRONMENT."
 THIS PROPOSAL WILL BE DISCUSSED AND VOTED UPON AT OUR NEXT ANNUAL MEETING, MAY 31st, JUNE 1-2, 1974, AT MANOMET, MASS.
