




Fig. 2. Measured wing-length plotted against wing-length estimated using the method described in the text (and based on the length of each bird's 8th primary) for samples of (a) Red Knots and (b) Ruddy Turnstones.




Fig. 3. Frequency distribution of the difference, estimated wing-length minus measured wing-length, for samples of (a) 74 Red Knots and (b) 101 Ruddy Turnstones (see text for methods of measurement and estimation).

Equation 1

Mass = -87.6(SE 67.2) + 1.49(SE 0.43)*Measured wing-length

R-Sq = 10.6%, n = 101, p=0.001

Equation 2

Mass = -47.4(SE 78.7) + 1.23(SE 0.51)*Estimated wing-length


R-Sq = 5.6%, n = 101, p<0.05

It is likely that the ability to estimate wing-lengths from the length of the 8th primary will not be a complete solution. No doubt birds will be caught that are moulting the 8th and have a badly abraded wing-point. Instances like this may be so rare that such birds can be omitted from analysis. However, it might be worth having available a regression equation based on the 7th primary as an alternative.
