

BIRD CALENDAR, 1931 – 27th Year

Bulletin No. 3 – June 19, 1931

This bulletin covers the month of May. One hundred eighty-two species of birds are listed of which ninety are new for the year. Only the new birds are numbered. More species of birds usually may be seen and identified in May than any other time because the height of the spring migration is reached then. Evidence indicated that this year the height came on the 18th, 19th and 20th. This is a few days late.

Mr. Watterson writes, "I found most of the species of warblers, but comparatively few of each, and several that are usually common, I found only once or twice – notably the Magnolia."

This general scarcity of warblers is verified by other observers. A few species were as common or more so than usual, however. These were redstarts, oven-birds, yellow warblers, black-poll warblers and blue-winged warblers.

Dr. Hulme comments on the fact that birds have been less numerous in Wade and Rockefeller Parks recently than in years past – notably the blue-bird, wood thrush, brown thrasher, crested flycatcher, warbling vireo, woodpeckers, warblers, and orioles. This he attributes partly to the heavier traffic but principally to the undesirable cutting and clearing away of undershrubbery, dead leaves, and brush.

Attention is called in particular to a few species in the following records which are of unusual interest because of their rarity. These are: blue goose, dowitcher, willet, golden eagle, Hoyt horned lark, golden-winged warbler, orange-crowned warbler, worm-eating warbler, Connecticut warbler, pipit, and short-billed marsh wren.
