JEFF GILL'S SPARROW TRAP

Mr. Frazier was the lucky winner of one of these traps donated by Mr. Gill and auctioned off at last year's annual meeting. He began using it about April 10, 1950 and between that date and August 27, 1950, captured 66 birds of 19 species representing 7.3% of his total captives for the period. It was used with water bait after May 11, 1950. The following table lists his captives in this trap by months:
