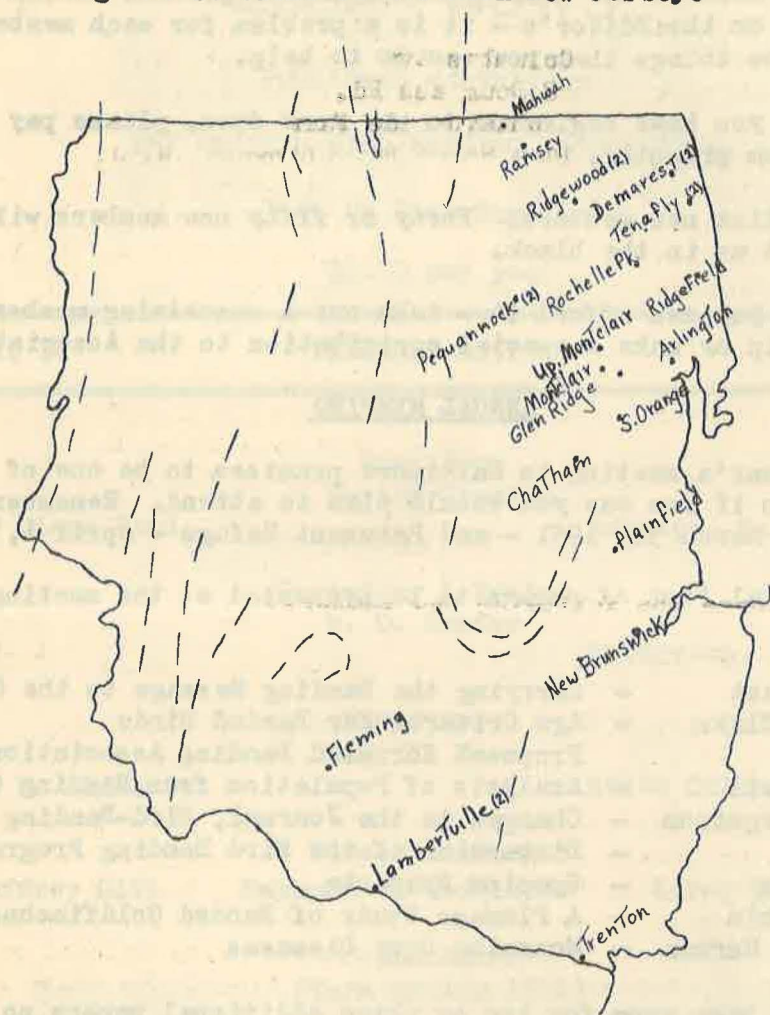


BANDERS IN NORTH JERSEY

Here is another in Steve Fordham, Jr.'s series of maps, this one showing the stations of northern New Jersey.



Some of the important mountain ridges are briefly outlined. It should also be of interest to note that almost two-thirds of the New Jersey banders or twenty stations are located around the population centers of Northeastern New Jersey in an area twenty miles wide and forty-five miles long.
