By all means, as Mr. Pepper advises, have it understood right now with your family and your lawyer that upon your death or in the event of an incapacitating accident or illness you wish a particular fellow bander to be called in to complete your records and to prepare and forward to the Banding Office all reports that have not been submitted.

No cash value ought to be attached to one's banding records and field notes. Equipment, reference library, periodicals do have cash values. If these are to be sold, it is well to realize that your heirs might just as readily underestimate the fair value of your Auks, Condors, Bird-Bandings, et al as to exaggerate their value and might dispose of them for far less than was fair and reasonable. Here gain designating a competent individual or organization would protect the interests of your estate.

Remember the lady mentioned above. Her traps are rusting away and disintegrating; now of no value or use to anyone. Silver fish are consuming the remnants of her notes and records. In the forthcoming bird book for her native state, her name will be seldom mentioned when it should appear on every other page as the authority for many significant and important records!
