REDWING BANDING PROGRAM By Brooke Meanley

The Cooperative Redwinged Blackbird Nestling Banding Program of the Atuxent Wildlife Research Center completed its second successful year in 1960, with a considerable increase over the previous year in the number W Mirds banded. A total of 2,134 nestlings were reported banded by 50 moperators, compared to 1,125 reported in 1959. Prior to 1958, the total mber of nestling Redwings banded in eastern North America was usually der 200 per annum.
