Two Grosbeaks were kept about two weeks because of injuries. One male was released apparently okay and the female after being released was found dead in the yard later. Our banding totals for 1964 were 4234 birds of 102 species, which bettered our 1963 totals of 1634 birds of 90 species.

FIRST BOOK ON BIRDS OF PERU

Las Aves del Departamento de Lima, by Dr. Maria Koepcke, the first book on birds of Peru, has just been published in Lima.
