23-YEAR-OLD CORMORANT

The following record may be of interest to EBBA News readers:

Double-crested Cormorant #418-07815 banded July 14, 1941 at Little Egg Rock, Muscongus Bay, Maine.

Entangled in net Summer 1964 at Lineken Neck Maine -- reported by E. M. Stebbins, Wall Point, Boothbay Harbor, Maine. (Lineken Neck is approximately 9 miles west of Little Egg Rock.)

This is undoubtedly the oldest recovery for a Cormorant, although I have two 17-year-old birds.
