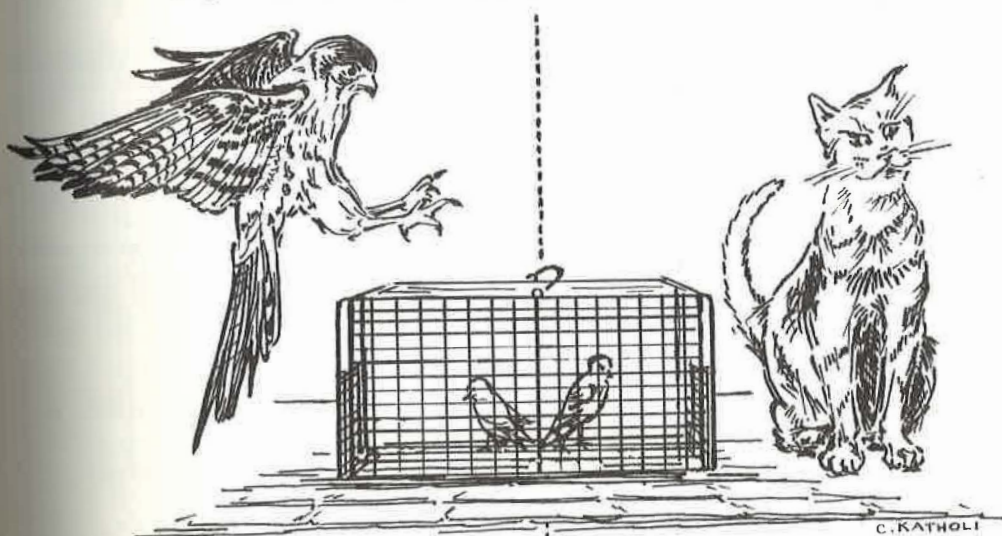


- Monday - A gray squirrel arrives at the feeding station in mid-morning and inactivates all the traps.

- Sunday - Dawn reveals a large (angry) cottontail rabbit hunched in a 9 x 9" trap compartment, and evening falls upon a stray dog dragging away to the woods a trap containing suet.
