EBBA's \$100 AWARD IN ORNITHOLOGY

EBBA members are urged to use their influence to give all possible publicity to our \$100 award in ornithology — an award which we give each year to a student, undergraduate or graduate, who uses bird banding in an ornithological study.

Qualifications for the award include: the college must be within the U.S. and the applicant, if an undergraduate, must be a junior or senior majoring in Zoology or biology with a B average using bird banding as a part of his research; if a graduate, he must major in ornithology and use bird banding as a part of his thesis.

In order to apply, the student merely writes requesting consideration and encloses a description of his project in which he explains how he uses bird banding — his description must be signed by his department head.
