COLOR-MARKED REDWINGED BLACKBIRDS

Redwinged Blackbirds are being color-tagged in several locations in Florida by the U.S. Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife. The purpose is to determine the origins of the Redwings that damage winter sweet corn in the Belle Glade-Pahokee Section of Florida. The birds have the regular U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service numbered band on one leg and a two-inch long fluorescent streamer affixed to the other. The banding locations, and the color used at each, are as follows:

Kraemer and Torry Islands, Lake Okeechobee - Yellow Pahokee - Orange Gainesville - Pink Northern east coast of Florida - Green
