THE 1968 ANNUAL EBBA MEETING

The 1968 EBBA Annual Meeting will be held at Oglebay Park, Wheeling, West Virginia. This is a municipal park of over 1200 acres. Although patronized by local groups, organizations from all over the country often select it for their annual meetings. The locale is exceptional. Some of the original buildings, dating back over a century, are still utilized for park use, though most of the buildings are relatively quite modern. The park's natural beauty is enhanced by skillful use of plantings of rare shrubs and trees. There are many foot paths and bridle trails. In addition, there are "civilized" features such as golf, tennis, swimming, greenhouses, arboretum, riding academy, etc.

Accomodations include the deluxe Wilson Lodge, cabins, and Camp Russell, all within the park. Lodging at the Wilson Lodge runs about \$8 single and \$14 double. Good food is served at the Oglebay Restaurant, at reasonable prices. Many of us will stay at Camp Russell where lodging is even more reasonable than at the Wilson Lodge, not only for the sake of economy, but also for the informal, outdoor atmosphere. Camp Russell is a pleasant few minutes stroll, in agreeable terrain, from the Wilson Lodge and the Oglebay Restaurant.

The official meeting dates are April 5 to 7. 1968. Persons who wish to arrive earlier or stay later may make independent arrangements by writing to Oglebay Park for literature and reservation applications. This literature is interesting even if you plan to be with the main group at Camp Russell and only during the scheduled meeting dates.

I am delighted to report that our host is the spirited, active and well-informed Brooks Bird Club, several of whose members are also members of EBBA. This club has in past years several times been host to other ornithological organizations. They will be well qualified to make us comfortable and to arrange an interesting program.
