We have heard about only one of the foreign recoveries published in the last issue - House Finch 75-07477. This bird was trapped by Mr. G. Hapgood Parks on March 9, 1970 at Hartford, Conn. as an AHY-F, which had a green plastic color band on the left leg. It had been banded by Richard Cohen at Atlantic Beach, L.I., N.Y. on July 15, 1969 as HY-U.

A full 23 more foreign retraps have been reported, all of them of one family, Fringillidae. Check your records to see if any are yours...
