

EBBA News welcomes papers and notes containing significant knowledge gathered at banding stations, new techniques, improvements on old techniques, station reports and book reviews.

Manuscripts should be submitted to the editor, preferably typewritten, always double spaced, on one side of standard ($8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ inch) paper with at least one inch margins all around. Photographs may be submitted and are welcomed. They can be color or Black and White glossy prints (not slides). Captions for photos must be on separate paper, numbered, with a corresponding number on the rear of the photograph. Drawings and graphs must be done on sturdy paper, preferably in india ink; they must never be larger than 5 3/4 x 7 3/4 inches at any time. We can only reduce (photographically) graphs more than 10% if the captions and other written material is in large blockletters.

If more than five works are cited in a paper, a reference section should terminate the paper. Citations should follow the style given in the following example: (Knorr, Sunbathing behavior of screech owls, <u>EBBA News 33</u>: 116-118, 1970). Bird weights and measurements should be in metric units. Bird names and the order of presentation should follow the 1957 ed. of the A.O.U. Checklist.

Material for Atlantic Flyway Review should be submitted each calender year, as follows:

Stations in Maine, Massachusetts, Rhode Island and Connecticut <u>along</u> the coast: 1 January. All other stations: 1 March...

The purpose of this column is to set aside a section of EBBA NEWS for reports on migration studies, hence, any bander who does migration work (whether formerly an O.R., or presently an AMFO station, or neither of these) is welcome to submit a station report.
