The Recovery Report section of this column, is a permanent service of EBBA NEWS to ornithologists, whether professional or amateur. Should your studies require the use of these recoveries, you need but turn to the News, and there they are. The Foreign Retrap Info Exchange is a service of temporary duration. It helps the finder to locate the bander and the banding data rapidly, while the Bird Banding Laboratory is still in the midst of their data quality checks, thus slowing up the "report to the bander" and "Certificate of appreciation" cards.

Data put together from correspondence of the bander and finder after the number is printed in the Foreign Retrap Info Exchange section will be used (eventually) in the recovery report section, unless the bander notifies me that he would prefer not to have this recovery in print. If no one notifies us to this respect, they will be used.

All the data, gathered through these two sections have now been put on index cards. We find that 112 band numbers (incl. those in this issue) have been published and that, besides the 29 recoveries published, we still have over 30 others which are eligible for publication.

Meanwhile, we urge all contributors to send us the following data:

- TO REPORT A FOREIGN RETRAP: Band Number; Species; Age/Sex; Date trapped or netted; whether trapped and released, or, found dead and location of trapping. This report is made to us by the finder.
- TO REPORT A RECOVERY: Please send us a Xerox copy of the report to the bander card. This is a report made to us by the bander.

We will notify bander/finder of data as we receive it.
