63. Rc. 107-32112 - Golden Crowned Kinglet, Age-Sex, unknown. Banded by Miss Dorothy Bordner at Island Beach N.J. on October 13, 1963; Recovered at Long Point, Ont. on April 23, 1965.
64. Rc. 696-80211 - Herring Gull, young when banded. Banded by Merrill E. Slate at Block Island, R.I., on June 19, 1964. Recovered at Island Beach by Miss Bordner on Sept 12, 1964.
65. Rc. 111-84261 - Least Flycatcher, Immature. Banded by Miss Bordner at Island Beach, N.J. on Sept. 7, 1966. Shot on unkn. day in December 1966 at Gulf Coast of Vera Cruz, Mexico (finder lives in town of Filomeno Mata, V.C., Mexico).
66. Rc. 119-74138 - Myrtle Warbler, HY-M. Banded by Frederick S. Schaeffer at Tobay Beach, L.I., N.Y. on 13 October 1969. Found dead at Panama City, Florida (southwest of Tallahassee, Fla, on the Gulf) on 27 February 1971.
67. Rc. 63-15554. Barn Swallow, banded as a nestling at Julian, Pa. by Dorothy Bordner on June 28, 1960. Trapped and released on Sept. 26, 1968 3mi. S.W. of Williston (coord. 442-0730) Vermont.
68. Rc. 106-80347. Tree Swallow, banded by D.I. Bordner at Island Beach N.J. on Sep 15, 1963. Found dead on May 31, 1965 at 3 mi. E. of Fregue Isle, Maine.
69. Rc. 111-83167. Canada Warbler, banded by Miss Bordner at Island Beach NJ on Sep 3, 1965. Killed due to striking a stationary object on June 20, 1970,, at Jeffersonville, Vermont.
