Heintzelman, Curator of Ornithology at the Museum, informed us that this research collection is open to banders and students who would like to make use of this facility.

In addition, the entire banding records of the late Mrs. Elise Dickerson are now located at this facility and may be used by anyone for research purposes. These records cover locations in New Jersey and Rhode Island.

Recent additions to the skin collection come from south of the border (Mexico, South America) and from local collection points. Fall warblers are adequately represented and spring warblers are being collected each year to augment those already available.

The library contains long runs of most publications of interest to banders in addition to many monographs and other research material.
