2018 Maryland Mid-winter Bird Count

The annual Maryland Mid-winter Bird Count was held 20 January through 3 February 2018. Results were submitted from Frederick, Carroll, Howard, and Baltimore Counties. Data were also submitted from the Chesapeake and Ohio (C&O) Canal for seven of its nine count days.

The C&O Canal locations included Montgomery County miles 15, 17, 18, 20, 21, 31 and 32; Frederick County (none for the actual count, but miles 46 and 58 were originally submitted as part of the Frederick County Mid-winter Count); Washington County miles 59 through 65, 68, and 70 through 72, with milepost 99 as a stationary count; and Allegany County miles 172 through 174, and mile 184 to Canal Terminus. The weather on the count days was typical for the end of January into February. Temperatures ranged from 33–55 °F (0.6–12.8 °C) with a one-day high of 60 °F (15.6 °C). The skies were overcast with intermittent light rain. Winds were light around 5 mph (8 kph) and the area waterways were open or had slight icing along the edges.

A total of 181 field observers comprising 121 parties reported 112 species for a total of 95,876 birds. The observers spent 327.68 hours on foot covering 272.05 mi (437.0 km). During the two-week count period, the observers also spent 162.58 hours traveling 1,941.8 mi (3,125.0 km) by car. Three counties reported time owling. These groups covered 42.3 mi (68.1 km) in 9.35 hours. A total of 39.2 hours was spent feeder watching.

As usual for this time of year, over 20 species of waterfowl were observed during this year's count. Canada Geese comprised the largest group with 26,364 individuals counted followed by Mallards with 1,846. Eleven species of sparrows were also observed this year. (Table 3).

The 9.35 hours spent owling produced four species for a total of 44 owls. This year's count included a high of 21 Barred Owls followed closely by 13 Great Horned Owls. Howard County had all four species represented including the lone Long-eared Owl recorded this year.

Observations of note in this year's count:

Several species of geese were recorded in the western counties this year. Snow Geese were recorded in Frederick and Carroll Counties. Two Ross's Geese were recorded in Frederick County and a total of 9 Greater White-fronted Geese were included in the C&O Canal and Frederick and Carroll Counties. Also included in this year's count was a Trumpeter Swan in Howard County.

One Great Cormorant was spotted in Baltimore.

All seven woodpecker species were represented this year. Frederick County had a high count of 12 Red-headed and 267 Red-bellied Woodpeckers.
