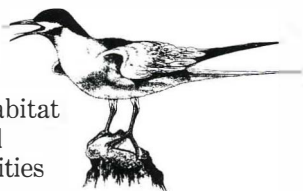
This goose, designed by J.N. "Ding" Darling, has become the symbol of the National Wildlife Refuge System.

Petit Manan National Wildlife Refuge

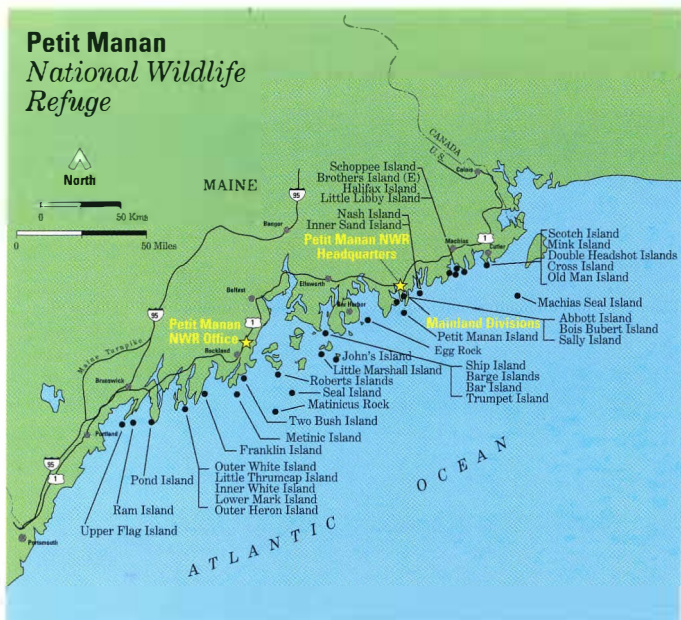
The Petit Manan National Wildlife Refuge Complex contains 40 offshore islands and three coastal parcels. The complex totals more than 7,000 acres and spans 200 miles of Maine's coastline. The U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service manages the complex as part of the National Wildlife Refuge System.

The Service's primary focus at Petit Manan is restoring and managing colonies of nesting seabirds. Refuge islands provide habitat for common, Arctic and endangered roseate terns; Atlantic puffins; razorbills; black guillemots; Leach's storm-petrels; laughing gulls and common eiders.

In addition to seabirds, wading birds and bald eagles nest on refuge islands. The mainland divisions provide habitat for songbirds, shorebirds and waterfowl, as well as opportunities for bird watching and hiking.
