FROM THE AUTHOR'S PREFACE.

"The many valuable records of ornithological matters contained in the columns of the FOREST AND STREAM, render the paper a necessity to the working ornithologist. I have had occasion, from time to time, to look up records, some of which had appeared years before; and the difficulty of finding just the note required led me to compile, for my own use, an index of some of the more important articles. It soon occurred to me that probably my brother naturalists were in the same predicament as myself, and since complete bound volumes of the FOREST AND STREAM are accessible to but few, it seemed worth while to compile a complete index, in order that the many valuable notes scattered through these files, might be more available. This has been done, and by giving a digest of each note or article under the species referred to, the reader has much more than a simple index, which would necessitate a reference to the original volume. The present work then embodies all the Bird Notes to be found in the FOREST AND STREAM for the time which it covers.
