## BLACK-NECKED STILTS AT RANKIN BOTTOMS, COCKE COUNTY, TENNESSEE

On 7 May 2004 we canoed with Leslie Gibbens and Linda Wright around Rankin Bottoms, a well-known shorebird location at the upper end of Douglas Lake in Cocke County, Tennessee. We saw and heard several expected species of shorebirds, but about midday a bird call behind us caught our attention. We turned just in time to see two Black-necked Stilts (*Himantopus mexicanus*) land about 70 meters away, in shallow (<10 cm deep) water.

This was the first sighting of this species in east Tennessee for at least two members of the party, and the stilts were a "life bird" for one member of the party. We watched the birds approximately 10 minutes before they flew, allowing us to study them in flight for approximately one minute before they disappeared, never to be relocated.

The birds we saw were lanky shorebirds with long necks, long bills, smallish heads, and long pointed wings. The birds' very long (nearly 1 ft) legs were pink. Their bills were long, straight, thin and black. Both were black on the back, nape, crown and most of sides of face. Each had one white spot above the eyes. Their rumps, seen in flight, were white. Undersides were white. A black band seemed to nearly encircle their necks. In flight their legs extended well beyond the very short tails. Digital photographs were taken by C. Muise.

The birds stayed in very close proximity to one another, mostly in shallow water with some emergent grass-like vegetation. At no point did we see them on dry land, and it is unlikely they would have been visible from any easily accessible land, such as the road to the coal tippie. Most of the wildlife habitat at Rankin Bottoms cannot be viewed from dry land at higher lake elevations (above 985 ft). A small boat is essential for a thorough survey of the area.

We did not realize the significance of this sighting immediately, but we have since discovered that this sighting represented only the second record of Black-necked Stilt in east Tennessee. Since then there have been three more records. To our knowledge the other records of Black-necked Stilt in East Tennessee include:

- 1 August 1985: one bird at Eagle Bend Fish Hatchery, Anderson County (Fowler 1986);
- 9-24 October 2004: one bird in Blount County (Knight 2005),
- 13 October 2004: one bird at Austin Springs, Washington County (Knight 2005), and
- 29 April 2006: one bird in Cumberland County (Knight 2006).

The record reported here was unanimously accepted by the Tennessee Bird Records Committee (Edwards 2006).

## THE SPRING SEASON

Normal to slightly above normal temperatures prevailed this season, while seasonal rainfall was a bit below normal. Much of the eastern half of the state still felt some effects of long-term drought conditions. Migration appeared to progress normally.

Rare waterfowl included Black-bellied and Fulvous Whistling-Ducks at Memphis and a Cinnamon Teal in Lincoln County, plus a smattering of Ross's Geese and scoters. Eared Grebes were found at four sites, but not at their recent stronghold on South Holston Lake. Among raptors were noteworthy reports of Swallow-tailed Kite in West Tennessee and Mississippi Kite in the East, plus two reports of Northern Goshawk. Shorebirds made a good showing, with multiple reports of Willets and White-rumped Sandpipers, plus Hudsonian and Marbled Godwits in the West, avocets in the two western regions, and a few phalaropes. A Thayer's Gull was a rare find, while two reports of Laughing Gull and three of Lesser Black-backed Gull were good.

A White-winged Dove and a Townsend's Solitaire in West Tennessee were stunning observations, as was a Painted Bunting in Knoxville. Warbler numbers seemed normal for recent times, but two separate reports of the Audubon's sub-species of Yellow-rumped Warbler were unexpected. Lingering nuthatches and finches were widespread following last winter's good boreal flight.

**WESTERN COASTAL PLAIN REGION** — The season was only slightly warmer and drier than normal. By most accounts, shorebirds and other migrants appeared in good, but not extraordinary, numbers. As noted in the winter report, it was a good year for irruptives. Red-breasted Nuthatches, Purple Finches, and Pine Siskins were widespread, numerous, and stayed late. Fish Crows continued a recent trend of population growth. The obvious goodies were both species of whistling-ducks, both godwits, White-winged Dove, Townsend's Solitaire, and the increasing numbers of Western Kingbirds and Scissor-tailed Flycatchers in the Memphis area. And Swallow-tailed Kite ain't bad!

**CUMBERLAND PLATEAU / RIDGE & VALLEY REGION** — Temperatures in March were near normal, but both April and May were warmer than normal

without any real cold snaps to delay vegetative growth or avian migration. Rainfall was near average for the first two months of the season, but May received only about half of the usual amount. Insufficient precipitation since the severe drought of last year resulted in the upper TVA lakes, generally upstream from Knoxville, failing to reach their normal seasonal levels by the end of May. Low rainfall and destruction of beaver dams at Standifer Gap Marsh resulted in good shorebird habitat, but made the marsh unsuitable for nesting by Least Bittern and Virginia Rail.

There was a decent shorebird flight, with multiple sightings of Willets and White-rumped Sandpipers. Olive-sided and Yellow-bellied Flycatchers were found two or three times apiece. Fairly good numbers of warblers were found, especially for the seldom seen Connecticut and rare-in-spring Wilson's. Notable finds this season included Eared Grebe, Mississippi Kite, Northern Goshawk, Common Moorhen, Red-necked and Wilson's Phalaropes, "Audubon's" Yellow-rumped Warbler, American Tree Sparrow, Nelson's Sharp-tailed Sparrow, and Painted Bunting.
