TWO EAST AFRICAN BARBETS

Tricholaema diadematum mustum subsp. nov.

Type, Museum of Comparative Zoölogy, no. 56,470, adult male, collected at the Guaso Nyiro River, Kenya Colony, 15, July, 1909, by Glover M. Allen.

Subspecific character.—Similar to T. d. diadematum, but larger, wing length, 81-85 mm.; 72-80 mm. in diadematum.

Range: northeastern Uganda, east through Kenya Colony, south to Mt. Kenia.

After noticing the size difference between two birds from the Guaso Nyiro and a series of eighteen from Ethiopia, I found that van Someren (Novitates Zoologicae, XXIX, 1922, p. 57) had previously made a similar observation. Thus, to quote from his paper, "A series of birds from the White Nile and South Ethiopia have wings of 70-77 mm., while birds from northeast Uganda south to Mt. Kenia, although having the same characteristic uniform belly, are considerably larger and have the same measurements as massaica." He records birds from Mt. Moroto, Kacheliba, Kerio, and Mt. Kenia, with wings 80-85 mm. long, as "Tricholaema diademata? subsp. nov.," and states that the bird recorded by Claude Grant (Ibis, 1915, p. 441) from the Turkwell River, has a wing length

of 82 mm.,"... and would belong to this apparently larger race."

Material examined: T. d. diadematum, 20; T. d. mustum, 2; T. d. massaicum, 3.

Pogoniulus bilineatus conciliator subsp. nov.

Type, Museum of Comparative Zoölogy, no. 237,561, adult female, collected at Nyange, Uluguru Mts., Tanganyika Territory, 11, October, 1926, by Arthur Loveridge.

Subspecific Characters.—Intermediate between P.b. fischeri and P.b. jacksoni. The chin and throat whitish and the superciliary stripes slightly yellowish, as in fischeri, the breast and belly more olivaceous than in fischeri, yellower than in jacksoni; size as in fischeri.

Measurements.—Type: wing, 51.5; tail, 27.5; culmen, 13 mm. Male: wing, 53; tail, 26; culmen, 14 mm.

Range: the Uluguru Mountains, Tanganyika Territory.

Six specimens of jacksoni have wings 53-56 mm. in length, tails measuring 30.5-32 mm., and culmens of from 12-14 mm. The coastal form, fischeri, agrees in measurements with conciliator.

Material examined: P. b. bilineatus, 1; P. b. fischeri, 1; P. b. conciliator, 2; P. b. jacksoni, 6.
