Mourning Dove with Three Legs.—On 2 July 1961 a half-decomposed adult Mourning Dove, Zenaidura macroura carolinensis, was found near Hickory Corners, Oconto County, Wisconsin. Upon examination, the writer discovered that the bird had three legs. One of the legs was normal, whereas the second had another small leg growing from its tibia-tarsus joint. This third leg, however, had only an inner and outer toe. The writer did not sex the bird and could not make a skin specimen of the bird because of its condition, but the legs were removed and are preserved in alcohol.—ROBERT G.
