SECOND PRINTING OF THE FIFTH EDITION OF THE A.O.U. CHECK-LIST

When the A.O.U. Check-list was published in 1957, provision was made for a set of special proofs from which the book could be reproduced if this should prove necessary. Demand for the volume has exceeded expectation, since the last of the 3,000 copies printed had been sold by June 1961. The second issue is now available at \$8.00 per copy, postpaid, on order from the Treasurer of the American Ornithologists' Union, c/o Fernow Hall, Cornell University, Ithaca, New York.

The new print is on the same grade of paper and is bound in the same blue buckram cloth as the first. The title stamped on the spine is in larger type, and on the back of the title page, below the copyright notice, there is the statement "Second printing, with minor corrections 1961."

It has been practicable to make correction of typographical and related errors that inevitably appear in the first printing of any work with the amount of detail found in this volume. The changes made are listed herewith so that those who have the first print may annotate their copies.
