Membership is \$18 for persons in all countries *except* the United States, Canada, Israel, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, and the following Western European countries: Iceland, Norway, Sweden, Finland, Denmark, Germany, The Netherlands, Belgium, Luxembourg, France, the United Kingdom, Ireland, Switzerland, Austria, Italy, Spain, and Portugal. All members receive the *Auk* and North American members receive a bimonthly *Ornithological Newsletter*. Subscription price to institutions is \$60. A Life Membership is \$1,050, paid in one sum or four annual installments of \$262.50. Gifts of any amount for the Endowment Fund are welcome and should be sent to the Treasurer.
