CAMP AGASSIZ

At Glen Alpine in the Lake Tahoe Forest Reserve, California

Is Now Open the Year Round

The camp is in Glen Alpine, a famous glacier gorge in the Sierras, six miles southwest of Tallac; elevation 6 700 feet above sea level. The camp site is on high ground a few hundred yards from the beautiful Modjeska Palls, amid a luxuriant grove of pine and fit trees. Within eight miles of Camp Agassiz are a dozen peaks from eight to ten thousand feet high, on whose sides lie eternal snow fields, and there are 44 lakes, of which 30 contain trout—eight different kinds. Is there such another region in the world?

Trout Fishing is now at its best.

Skeeing will be a feature of the winter season.
