BIBLIOGRAPHY OF CALIFORNIA ORNITHOLOGY

Second Installment, to the end of 1923, by JOSEPH GRINNELL; 192 pp.

Supplementary to Grinnell's "Bibliography of California Ornithology" (Pacific Coast Avifauna no. 5, 1909). It continues the work from the date upon which the first installment ends and includes many titles that were omitted from the earlier publication. Details of style conform closely with the first installment, so that the two Avifaunas, numbers 5 and 16, make a uniform whole. There is no duplication of entries. There were 1,785 titles listed in the first installment; there are 2,286 in the second, a total of 4,071 in the two parts. The two, together, are indispensable to any student of North American birds, and should be in every ornithological library in America.

Of the first installment, Dr. J. A. Allen, in review, remarked: "It is safe to say that this is the most important contribution to the bibliography of North American ornithology since the Couesian contributions of 1878-1880 set the high standard here closely followed."
