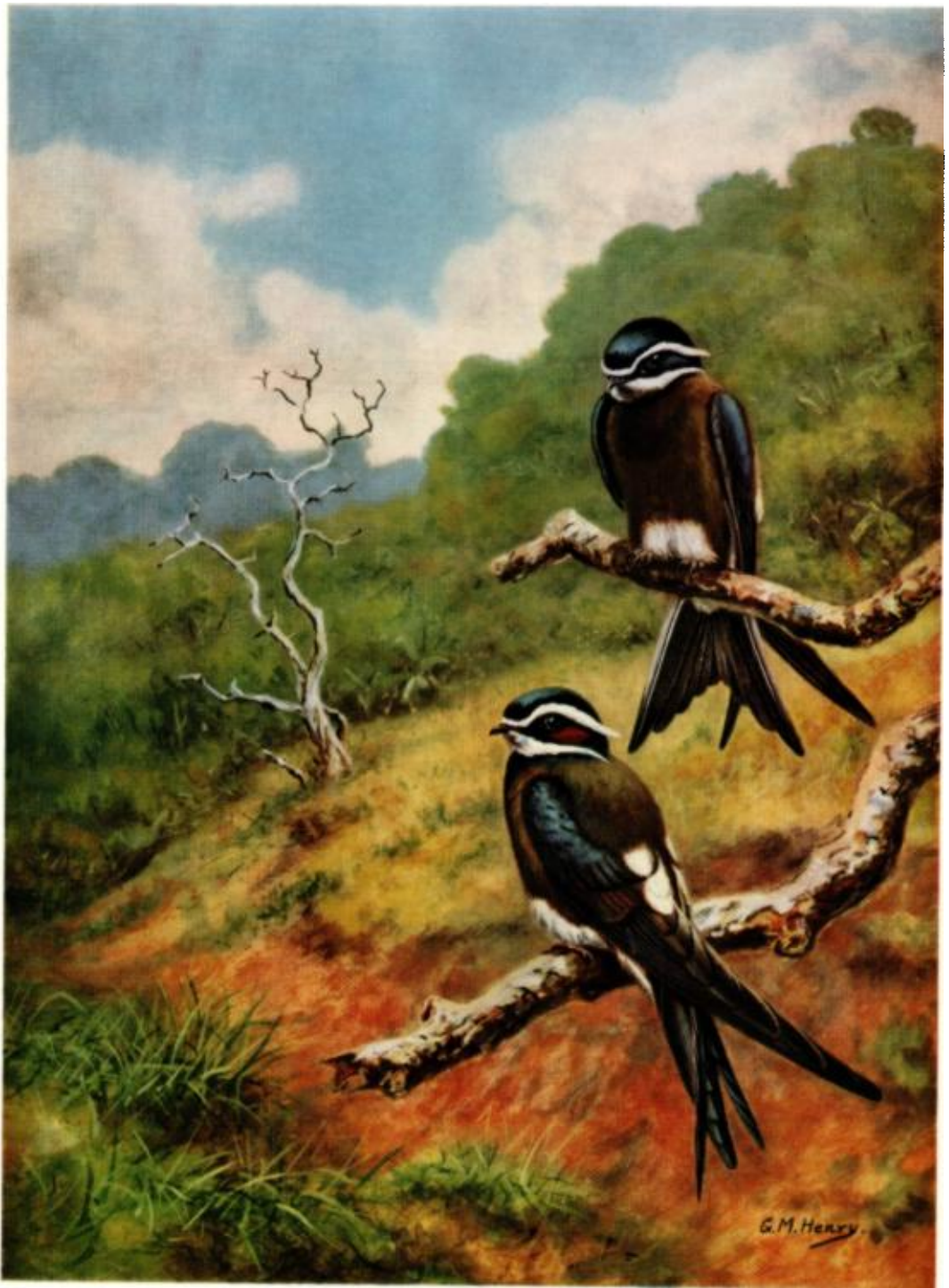

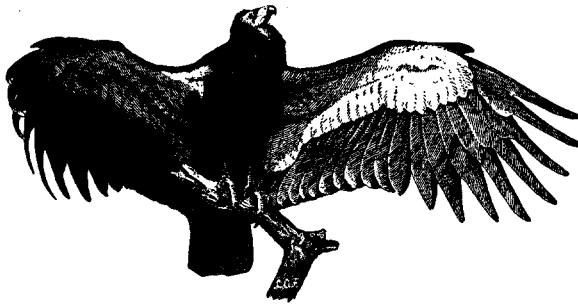


LESSER TREE-SWIFT
