### SUBSCRIPTION RATES

Subscription price to institutions and non-members, six dollars per volume, payable in advance. Single copies, one dollar and fifteen cents each.

## MEMBERSHIP DUES

Regular members, five dollars per year, of which four dollars are for a year's subscription to The Condor; student members, four dollars per year; sustaining members, seven dollars and fifty cents per year; contributing members, twenty-five dollars per year. All classes of membership receive The Condor.

The life membership fee is one hundred and fifty dollars and the patron's membership fee is one thousand dollars. No additional dues are required. The money from both life and patron's membership fees is invested and only the earning therefrom is used to help defray

expenses for the society's publications.

### MANUSCRIPTS

Send manuscripts for publication to the Editor, James R. King, Department of Zoology, Washington State University, Pullman, Washington 99163. Manuscripts should contain original information and a clear indication of its significance and its relationship to existing knowledge. Material that has been published elsewhere in any substantial part cannot be included.

Submit copy typewritten on one side of standard (8½ × 11 inch) bond paper. Text pages through the list of references should be numbered. Tables and legends for figures should be

included as separate, unnumbered pages.

Drawings must be made with India ink on durable paper or board. Photographic reproductions of drawings are acceptable if they are glossy prints of professional quality. Do not use typewritten labels within a drawing or graph. Photographs to be reproduced as halftones must be glossy prints of good contrast. Illustrations should be planned to permit reduction without loss of legibility or significant detail (approximate maximum width is

Provide a concise, definitive title and, if necessary, subheadings within the text. A terminal list of references should be given for articles that contain more than five literature citations. Otherwise, citations may be included parenthetically in the text. Check the accuracy of citations against original sources and adhere to bibliographic form in past issues of The Condor. A factual summary is recommended for longer papers.

Scientific names of species should follow the usage of the A.O.U. Check-list of North

American Birds, Fifth Edition (1957), or an appropriate equivalent. The use of metric units is required in all measurements of birds and their physical environment; exceptions can be made in specific cases if there is a defensible preference for English units. The military system of calendar notation (e.g., 1 January 1966) will be applied uniformly, and the use of military clock-time is strongly recommended.

For abbreviations, including the titles of serial publications, consult the Style Manual for

Biological Journals, Second Edition (Amer. Inst. Biol. Sci., Washington, D.C. 1964), or

past issues of The Condor.

# IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR SUBSCRIBERS TO THE CONDOR

The annual subscription price of The Condor has been increased from \$6 to \$10. This change applies to all subscriptions received after 1 May 1967, and becomes effective with volume 70 (1968) of the journal. Subscribers who have already paid for a 1968 subscription will receive the journal at the former price, but should note that the subscription in 1969 will be \$10.

The Cooper Ornithological Society regrets that rising costs of publication have necessitated this action.

It should be noted by members of the Society that their membership dues, which include subscription to The Condor, are not affected by this change.

In addition, effective with volume 70 (1968), The Condor will become a quarterly journal published in January, April, July, and October. Librarians and subscription agencies should alter their records accordingly.
