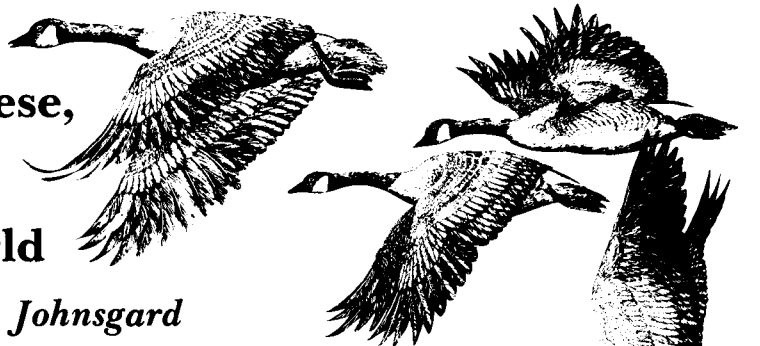


Ducks, Geese, and Swans of the World

The only one-volume comprehensive survey of ducks, geese, and swans available in English, this book is both written and illustrated by one of the world's foremost authorities on waterfowl behavior. It combines detailed line drawings and color photographs with the most recent information on all of the nearly 150 recognized species of the ten tribes of Anatidae. The accounts of each species include scientific and vernacular names, descriptions of the distribution of all recognized subspecies, selected weights and measurements, and identification criteria for both sexes and various age classes. Also included are descriptions of habitats, foods, social behavior, reproductive biology and present population status. The author's studies of the gannetry on Bass Rock have formed the basis for most of our knowledge of the gannet's ecology, breeding cycle, and behavior. Chapter topics are: plumage, shape, structure and voice; numbers and distribution; behavior; ecology; the bird at sea; the gannet family & order; the gannet and man.
