STUDIES IN AVIAN BIOLOGY No. 5. This analysis of energy expenditure by the Black-billed Magpie through one annual cycle in eastern Washington is the result of integrated field and laboratory study. Principal topics considered include the thermal environment and its influence on the biology of the magpie and energy budgeting in the annual cycle, followed by a discussion of these in relation to other aspects of the ecology and behavior of the species and a comparison with other species.

Based on over 11 years of daily observations by Point Reyes Bird Observatory personnel, this work summarizes all known data for the 346 species of birds occurring on or around the islands; 223 are freshwater or terrestrial forms, for a landmass of 0.41 km², 32 km from the northern California coast \$10.00
