ANNUAL VARIATION OF DAILY ENERGY EXPENDITURE BY THE BLACK-BILLED MAGPIE; A STUDY OF THERMAL AND BEHAVIORAL ENERGETICS. *By John N. Mugaas and James R. King. May 1981. 78 pp. SAB No. 5.* This analysis of expenditure of energy by the Black-billed Magpie through one annual cycle in eastern Washington is the result of integrated field and laboratory study. Principal topics considered include the thermal environment and its influence on the biology of the magpie and energy budgeting in the annual cycle, followed by a discussion of these in relation to other aspects of the ecology and behavior of the species and a comparison with other species \$8.00


