## IDENTIFYING THE MAJOR WINTERING GROUNDS OF PALEARCTIC WADERS ALONG THE ATLANTIC COAST OF AFRICA FROM MARINE CHARTS: CORRECTIONS




Figure 1. Coastal sites of probable or known international importance for waders on the Atlantic coast of Africa. Numbers refer to the sites listed in Tables 2 - 7, as follows:

Regretably, some editorial errors and omissions crept into this paper by Alan Tye in Wader Study Group Bull. 49: 20-27. Our most comprehensive was the omission from Tables 2 to 7 of site numbers referring to those in Figure 1. To correct this, and to simplify reference, we reprint Figure 1 below, with an added caption that lists all site numbers and names.

In addition, there are the following corections to the paper:

- Figure 1 key: >2000 waders counted should read >20 000 waders counted.
- Table 1. The mean density of 12.3 is the mean of the values for Walvis Bay (9.9) and Sandwich Harbour (17.1).
- Table 3. The Scarcies Estuary muddy sand and sand-banks areas should be bracketed, with a single asterisk following.
- Table 6. The areas for Baie de Nazare and Baie du Cap Lopez should be bracketed, with a double asterisk following. Similarly the areas for Zaire River mud shores and sand-banks should be bracketed, with a double asterisk following.
- Table 8. The footnote should read: 'by implication, below their range for the richest stretch of Deach, i.e. <7 birds/km.
