

10TH INTERNATIONAL WATERFOWL ECOLOGY SYMPOSIUM & 1995 WSG MEETING

CONFERENCE PROGRAMME

The 10th International Waterfowl Ecology Symposium (18-21 September) will be built around a central theme of 'Approaches to predicting the effect of habitat loss and change on populations of waterbirds'. As usual talks are not restricted to waders but will also cover wildfowl and other waterbird species. There will be a number of invited speakers on the central theme but we wish to have also as many offered papers as we can. On 20 September, Wednesday afternoon, there will be an excursion to the Aveiro lagoon system and to a sand dune nature reserve.

The Wader Study Group meeting (15-18 September), which precedes the Symposium, will not have a specific theme, and talks and posters are invited on all aspects of wader biology. The 1995 Annual General Meeting will take place at 09.00 hr of Saturday morning. The rest of Saturday and Sunday morning will be devoted to a programme of talks. On Sunday afternoon there will be an excursion to the Mondego flood plain, 50 km south of Aveiro.

On Monday 18 September, two workshops will be held in parallel with other round table discussions taking place as part of the Waterfowl Ecology Symposium; one on Blackwinged Stilts *Himantopus himantopus* and the other on Kentish Plover *Charadrius alexandrinus*.

TRAVEL AND GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS

The registration desk will be open for the WSG Conference from 16.00 hr on Friday 21 September. For those attending only the Waterfowl Ecology Symposium, the registration desk will again be open from 16.00 hr on Sunday 17 September. To get to Aveiro you can either fly to Lisboa or Porto and then get a train to Aveiro. A shuttle service is being organised to collect people at the railway station, so please let the organisers know your estimated time of arrival. If you are travelling by train please note that for the fast trains (Alpha service and Intercity) reservations have to be made in advance (please consult your travel agent or your railway company). There are c. 10 trains per day, both from Porto and Lisboa.

You can get to Aveiro by car using the motorway A1 if you come from the north or south, or the freeway IP5 if you are coming from the east. This last road ends in Aveiro (see map).

During the Conference you will not need transportation as the sessions will take place in the University campus and thus very close to the student residences where most people will be staying.

ACCOMMODATION, MEALS AND COSTS

There will be a registration fee of 10 000 (ten thousand) PTE for the two Conferences which includes the two excursions. If you want to attend only the WSG Conference (15-17 September), the fee is 6 000 PTE which includes the Sunday excursion. The fee for the Waterfowl Ecology Symposium alone (18-21 September) will be 8 000 PTE which includes the Wednesday excursion. These fees cover only administration costs.

Participants will be accommodated at the University residences on the campus for a moderate cost, ranging from 2 000 to 3 500 PTE per night. Most of the rooms are singles without a bathroom, but there are also some doubles with a bathroom. For those requesting it, hotels will be available in a price range of *c.* 5 000 to 10 000 PTE per person per night.

The campus restaurant will be open to all participants (including those staying in hotels) on:



BLACK-WINGED STILT WORKSHOP

On Monday 18 September, following the Wader Study Group Conference and in parallel with other round table discussions taking place as part of the Waterfowl Ecology Symposium, there will be a workshop on Black-winged Stilt *Himantopus himantopus*.

Despite the research carried out over the last decade on this species, the population dynamics of the Black-winged Stilt is not yet well understood. Known to be opportunistic, using a wide variety of habitats, many of them man-made, the species shows sharp fluctuations in numbers in some areas and reasonable stability in others. On the other hand, wintering numbers in south-west Europe have recently increased although no information is available on the situation in the west African wintering grounds.

At this workshop we aim to bring together people working with this species in order to discuss recent findings and to draw up guidelines for future research. We shall have a few invited speakers, mostly from Europe, but also from Africa.

WORKSHOP FOR USERS OF THE UNDERHILL INDEX METHOD

As part of the 10th International Waterfowl Ecology Symposium, it is proposed to hold a short workshop on the use of the Underhill index for analysing trends in bird populations. The Underhill index is a technique for making optimal use of available count data in estimating relative population sizes (index numbers) and is now used routinely in examining trends in national and international waterbird populations.

The workshop is intended to be primarily a forum for the discussion of issues relating to the estimation and interpretation of index numbers for bird populations. Some recent developments to the technique will also be discussed and there will be a demonstration of some software, which will be made freely available.
