

WHSRN DEVELOPMENTS - AND WHSRN WORKSHOP TRANSCRIPTS NOW AVAILABLE

In WSG Bulletin 77 we published transcripts of the closing speeches of the Western Hemisphere Shorebird Reserve Network (WHSRN) Workshop held in Ottawa, Canada from 11-13 May 1995. The workshop was convened to celebrate the tenth anniversary of the WHSRN programme and to evaluate its progress in North and South America.

A 94-page volume of transcripts of all talks and presentations given at the workshop is now available.

Attended by representatives from all WHSRN sites, collaborating government and private agencies and scientists, the workshop produced a clear set of conclusions. recommendations and priorities for the future. Based on the positive results of the meeting, WHSRN has become a revitalised and dynamic programme. A full-time Director (James M. Corven) is now based at the WHSRN Secretariat office at Manomet Observatory, a council steering committee was established to facilitate the formation of a new advisory Council, and in 1996 two further major WHSRN site have been officially designated: Grays Harbour, Washington and Kachemak Bay, Alaska.

Other initiatives recommended by the Workshop are now being developed. These include proposals to develop a US National Shorebird Conservation Plan to assess shorebird habitat in US Forest Service lands, to expand the international Save Our Migratory

Shorebirds educational programmes, to convert the International Shorebird Survey (ISS) data into practical management information, and to complete assessments of critical shorebird habitats in Mexico.

Other plans include renewing publication of the WHSRN Newsletter, reactivating the Piping Plover Registry, a new conservation award, and completing and updating the International Directory of WHSRN sites.
