


## GLENHAVEN TREE TRAP

# W.B.B.A. Two-Compartment Trap

This trap, measuring 7"x8"x10", is divided into two compartments each 5" wide, 8" high and 7" deep.

Each compartment is provided with a drop door and automatic treadle of the type used on Potter traps. The treadles are attached to the trap and counter-balanced so that the doors will not be tripped by the jar of a bird alighting on the trap, or by the falling of the other door.


