## Note of Correction

In the January, 1941 issue of Bird-Banding in the article by Horace Groskin, "The Invasion and Wing Measurements of the Eastern Purple Finch at Ardmore, Pa.", the author refers to my article, "The Length of Stay of Migratory Birds in Southeastern Pennsylvania" which appeared in Bird-Banding, Vol. 10, 1939, pp. 145–149.

Mr. Groskin on page 10 states that the basis used by me in computing the length of stay was the number of days that elapsed after the bird was first captured until the bird re-entered the traps, this is true where an individual only repeated once but in every case the last repeat was used when later captures were made. This is an exact duplicate of the method Mr. Groskin uses in his article.
