CORRECTION.—In Bird-Banding XVII, April, 1946, page 69, in Miss Cooke's paper on "Returns of Banded Birds" was a recovery record for a Blue Jay supposed to have been banded at Orlando, Florida, August 12, 1942 by S. B. Fickett, Jr., which was found dead at Rockville Centre, N. Y. in December, 1943. Mr. Geoffrey Gill now writes that this record was so contrary to all other such records tabulated that he immediately questioned it and in the ensuing correspondence with the Fish & Wildlife Service it developed that the bird was banded in Rockville Centre, N. Y. and was found dead in the same locality later.
