Margaret Brooks Hickey

We regret to report that one of our former editors, who served the National Audubon Society in a variety of ways for nine years, died at her home in Madison, Wisconsin, on December 29, 1976. We remember "Peggy" Hickey first from the days when she was Margaret Brooks, a young editorial assistant and later editor of Bird-Lore and Audubon Magazine in the 1930s and early '40s. Bright, friendly, modest, always thoughtful and careful of speech, but scientifically strict, she came often to meetings of the Linnaean Society of New York and took an active part in the affairs of that organization. During those years she edited the Audubon Christmas Bird Count and the Breeding Bird Censuses of Audubon Field Notes: for several years she was the only editor of our journal whose name was listed.

After her marriage to ornithologist Joseph J. Hickey, she made her home in Madison, Wisconsin, where she pursued her editorial

career in a variety of ways—predominantly for the University of Wisconsin Press She was a 30-year bird bander, and shared an active life with her family and far-flung friends. Many times, in recent years, we sought out her editorial advice, and always to our profit. We miss her.

Herbert Krause

Herbert Krause, a former Regional Editor for Audubon Field Notes, died in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, on Sept. 21, 1976 Krause was an active field observer for many years, and was author of the chapter on South Dakota in O. S. Pettingill Jr's Bird Watcher's America. He was a frequent contributor to state and national ornithological journals. In 1963 he was a lecturer for the National Audubon Society.

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
