#### **CORRIGENDA**

In American Birds, January 1981 (Vol. 35: 14) the Editor stated, quite erroneously, that there were 12 records of Rusty Blackbird for the West Coast. The actual total, as recorded by Roberson, in Rare Birds of the West Coast, Woodcock Publications, 1980, is 100 + . In citing the records for Washington (10) and Oregon (2) the California records (90+) were omitted, with about 12 more records being added there each year.

Joseph R. Jehl, Jr., who keeps us honest, suggests that the South Polar Skua illustrated on the cover of our May, 1981 issue (Vol. 35, No. 3) was not, as stated, a light-phase bird. See Manolis, this issue (p. 000) for a description of this phase.

Going back further, in the article on Pelagic Birds in the northern Gulf of Mexico, by Duncan and Harvard, a photo labeled Sooty Terns (AB 34: 131) should have read "Sooty Tern (1.) and Black Tern (r.)," and the photographer, who was not credited, was Roy W. Lowe, III.
