## Fifty-first Breeding Bird Census

HIS YEAR'S TOTAL OF 78 CENSUS plots exactly doubles the number received last year. This is tremendous news to all of us! Even better yet, it actually represents *more* censuses, as a total of 105 were actually submitted, including censuses conducted in past years; 1984, 1985, and 1986 (compared with 40 for 1986). We are especially pleased to get the data for these past years and urge that other observers, who have outstanding data on hand, send it in so it can be added to the data bank. This should be done even if the data has been published in some other journal.

This year's summary represents the efforts of 124 observers, who spent over 3467 hours in the field and censused 1471 2 hectares (including results reported from prior years). The highest number of hours spent on any one census was 291. The average sized census was 14.0 hectares, with a range from 1.9 to 42. The total number of species ranged from 3 to 63, and averaged 21.4.

Special forms are now being used to report census results. If you do not have these forms *please* request them from Cornell before writing up next year's results.

The data compiled in the table below are stored in a computer at the Laboratory of Ornithology at Cornell University.
