President's Message

The annual meeting of WBBA in Albuquerque, New Mexico was held in conjuntion with WBBA's parent organization, the Cooper Ornithological Society.

J. David Ligon chaired the host committee and deserves a special thank you from WBBA for his efforts. Meeting in conjunction with COS gave banders access to many presentations, including George A. Hall's long-time banding studies in the Appalachians, and a special symposium on the value of long-term studies, a topic of obvious interest to banders. WBBA presented a banding demonstration, with former President L. Richard (Dick) Mewaldt demonstrating proper netting techniques, Past President Charles T. (Charlie) Collins showing us how to get nets up into the canopy - without too much dificulty in getting the birds down to band — and Secretary Robert C. (Bob) Tweit indicating some ways in which the computer can help banders. These gentlemen were all kind enough to repeat their presentations on a second day for those who missed the initial demonstration.

The WBBA annual meeting was fairly well attended, with EBBA Editor, Nadia (Mickie) Mutchler, present as a special guest. Besides Collins and Mewaldt, former Presidents in attendance included Martha Balph and Howard Cogswell. We welcome Martha back on to the Board, along with newcomer, Michael Rigney. The next President's Message will contain details of actions taken, primarily in the (unfortunate) necessity of raising dues and some proposed by-law revisions. An important highlight was the announcement conveyed by Selection Committee Chairman, Robert C. Leberman, of the selection of Thomas A. Stierhoff of Flagstaff, Arizona as the recipient of the 1983 WBBA grant. We look forward to reading the results of Mr. Stierhoff's project, "Cooperative breeding in the Western Bluebird."

A running theme of my messages last year concerned the importance of long-term banding studies at fixed stations. The New Mexico meeting gave us all a chance to learn about one such station. Chuck Hundertmark spoke on the aims, efforts, and results to date of the banding program of the Rio Grande Nature Center in Albuquerque; many of us visited the center the next day.

WBBA members who were not able to attend this year will have a chance to see two banding stations in operation in 1984. We shall be meeting at the newly-established South San Francisco Bay Bird Observatory near San Jose, California with a trip to the long-established and highly successful Point Reyes Bird Observatory. Details will be announced as they fall into place but, for now, keep Easter and the weeks before and after open until we settle the exact date. We hope to see many members there!

Members who cannot travel to New Mexico or California need not feel left in the dark about the activities of banding stations in WBBA territory. WBBA Editor, Eleanor Radke, has invited about 30 stations in our area to contribute station reports — generally along the lines long given by EBBA and recently initiated by IBBA. If your station was not included in the invitation, please write to Eleanor and ask for the excellent package of guidelines prepared by her and Steve Russell. The station reports will not be complete until every province and state in WBBA territory is represented!

II. Passerines

Ash-throated Flycatcher. 1171-28330. Banded as AHY-U by David R. Bontrager at Starr Ranch Audubon Sanctuary, CA on 25 May 1975. Renetted at same location on 7 June 1981. Male, at least 7 years old; 5 previous returns.

Black Phoebe. 850-53119. Banded as AHY-U by David Bontrager at Starr Ranch Audubon Sanctuary, CA on 4 May 1974. Renetted at same location on 6 June 1981. At least 8 years old; no previous returns.

Cliff Swallow. 78-32534. Banded as AHY-M by P.R.B.O. at Bolinas, CA on 26 June 1976. Renetted at same location on 15 May 1981. At least 6 years old; no previous returns.

Steller's Jay. 543-77498. Banded as ASY-U by Howard L. Cogswell at Hayward, CA on 2 April 1977. Retrapped at same location on 4 April 1981. At least 6 years old; 2 previous returns.

Scrub Jay. 873-52289. Banded as HY-U by Howard L. Cogswell at Hayward, CA on 9 October 1979. Caught by cat at San Leandro, CA (7 km northwest of banding site) on 21 April 1980.

Chestnut-backed Chickadee. 1420-41022. Banded as HY-U by P.R.B.O. at Bolinas, CA on 19 June 1976. Renetted at same location on 25 January 1981. Female, 4½ years old; several previous returns.

Bridled Titmouse. 29-27154. Banded as U-U by Sally H. Spofford at Portal, AZ on 5 December 1976. Retrapped at same location on 17 December 1981. At least $5\frac{1}{2}$ years old; no previous returns.

American Robin. 692-80270. Banded as AHY-F by P.R.B.O. at Bolinas, CA on 14 May 1976. Renetted at same location on 21 July 1981. At least 6 years old; 1 previous return.

Hermit Thrush. 78-31365. Banded as AHY-U by P.R.B.O. at Bolinas, CA on 27 January 1976. Renetted at same location on 30 January 1981. At least 5½ years old; no previous returns.

Hermit Thrush. 78-32349. Banded as HY-U by P.R.B.O. at Bolinas, CA on 12 October 1976. Renetted at same location on 3 November 1981. $5\frac{1}{2}$ years old; several previous returns.

Swainson's Thrush. 110-114983. Banded as U-U by P.R.B.O. at Bolinas, CA on 7 May 1975. Renetted at same location on 13 May 1981. Male, at least 6 years old; 1 previous return.

Swainson's Thrush. 110-115915. Banded as AHY-M by P.R.B.O. at Bolinas, CA on 29 June 1976. Renetted at same location on 23 June 1981. At least 6 years old; no previous returns.

Swainson's Thrush. 110-115956. Banded as AHY-U by P.R.B.O. at Bolinas, CA on 17 July 1976. Renetted at same location on 13 May 1981. Male, at least 6 years old; no previous returns.

Orange-crowned Warbler. 1300-51982. Banded as HY-U by Fern R. Tainter at San Luis Obispo, CA on 28 September 1976. Recovered by S. Perala at Kenai N.W.R., AK on 4 June 1982. 6 years old.

Virginia's Warbler. 1260-48720. Banded as U-U by D. Archibald McCallum at Cottonwood Gulch, NM on 1 August 1977. Renetted at same location on 29 July 1981. Male, at least 4 years old; 2 previous returns.

Painted Redstart. 27-29141. Banded as AHY-U by Sally H. Spofford at Portal, AZ on 30 January 1975. Retrapped at same location on 3 January 1981. At least 6½ years old; 5 previous returns (see also N.A.B.B. 4:143 and 6:125). (S.H.S. reports that this color-banded bird, a "regular" at her feeding station for 6 winters, was not seen again after January 1981.)


Yellow-headed Blackbird. 732-15588. Banded as AHY-M by John Cummings at Upham, ND on 17 August 1980. Shot at Jaral Del Progreso, Guanajuato, Mexico on 22 October 1980.

Common Grackle. 743-79784. Banded as AHY-M by John Cummings at Denver, CO on 6 May 1976. Found dead at Wheatridge, CO on 13 May 1981. At least 6 years old.

Rufous-crowned Sparrow. 81-45164. Banded as AHY-U by Howard L. Cogswell at Hayward, CA on 13 March 1978. Retrapped at same location on 4 April 1981. Female, at least 4 years old; 1 previous return.

Golden-crowned Sparrow. 1231-43985. Banded as HY-U by Ralph B. Williams near Juneau, AK in the spring of 1981. Tarsus, with band, found in coyote feces along the McKenzie River, Lane Co., OR in the fall of 1981.
