### New Life Member Ronald A. Ryder

Ronald A. Ryder, Professor of Wildlife Biology at Colorado State University, is WBBA's newest Life Member. However, he is not new to bird banding. His first banding was in 1949 and he has had his own permit since 1950.

Following the obtaining of B.S. and M.S. degrees at Colorado A & M College, Ronald served in the U.S. Navy as a Line Officer in active duty, and then went on to complete a Ph.D. at Utah State University. He has been outstandingly productive in teaching and research in wildlife biology. His numerous publications show a concentration of effort concerning waterbirds, but also a striking breadth of interest in diverse avian species and their environments.

Ronald is a member of many professional organizations in ornithology and wildlife biology. He is a Past President of WBBA (1968-70), Fort Collins Bird Club, Fort Collins Chapter of the National Audubon Society, Colorado Field Ornithologists, the Colorado Audubon Council, and is currently President of the Colorado-Wyoming Academy of Sciences. Ronald is an Elective Member of the American Ornithologists' Union and a Life Member of the National Wildlife Federation and the Wilson Ornithological Society.

He is the organizer of WBBA's 1985 Annual Meeting, to be in Estes Park, Colorado, in June. We anticipate with pleasure a most enjoyable and productive meeting, - and getting to know Ron, his colleagues and students, in surroundings of superlative beauty.
