Excerpts from Minutes of EBBA's 73rd Annual Meeting held 12-14 April 1996 at National Wildlife Visitor Center Laurel, Maryland

Memorial Grant Committee: Out of eight applicants, two grants of \$250 each were awarded. (See report published elsewhere in this section of the journal.)

Mist Net Committee: Gale Smith reported we are still having communications problems with our net supplier in Japan. Other possible sources of supply are being investigated.

Editor: Apology was made by Bob Pantle for the lateness of the last issue of *NABB*. He expressed a need for more people to referee submitted papers for publication. He also announced that Susannah Graedel offered to help prepare an index for *NABB*.

Historian: Brad Silfies has two volumes of historical books which he will be sending to the Smithsonian for archival storage.

Membership: Elaine Mease announced we added 22 new members in the past year but the year ended in a loss of 27 members for a current total membership of 483. She urged members to bring in new members and also to bring them to an annual meeting.

Legislative Awareness: Mary Forness has copies of important legislative items that members should be aware of and take action on.

Old Business: Mary Doscher, reporting on Operation Wingchord, said the committee is hopeful of soon being able to publish the results on Northern Mockingbird and Wood Thrush. More data are needed for Louisiana Waterthrush.

New Business: Robert Yunick reported on changes in the 1995 Internal Revenue tax code which states that anyone claiming a donation for a contribution of more than \$250 on their tax return must have on file a letter describing the donation. The Council has authorized Bob to prepare such a letter from EBBA to be signed by the treasurer Don Mease. He will work with the BBL to prepare a letter that they will also give to banders.
